There is a FAQ on our website that will give anyone an answer to mostly asked questions, i.e. when do I get paid? When do I have to submit my availability? How do I enter my availability? In addition, the news section of the website will have all Match Official Newsletters and our SACUSA newsletter, photos of past events and all other news update for umpires and scorers.

It is also exciting to announce a new range of merchandise, new bags, polo shirts and jackets, and a rugby top. These are all done in Adelaide, and the turnaround date after the order is between two and three weeks. Members can find the merchandise under the SACUSA tab. If the members would like to purchase any merchandise, please fill out the form and order your merchandise. Our new range of merchandise, including a trolley bag, is now available.

In addition, this year, SACUSA organised a photoshoot with all our umpires during one of the general meetings with our SACUSA shirt on for the first time. And SACUSA has plans to continue this type of photoshoot every two years with all the members with SACUSA shirts.

Our major event: SACUSA night was a successful event at the SAGE hotel this year. We had 97 participants in that event. The majority of the members have attended the programme and some of them with their spouses and families. This year, the Bradman and Rolton medal event was short due to Covid restrictions organised by SACA at the Adelaide Oval with way fewer participants than in previous years.

This is September 2021, and We are about to start our new season 2021-22 soon. And, the executive committee has plans for the whole season to foster, facilitate and develop our umpires through formal training, workshops and meetings. The upcoming year also has lots of events, including which will be notified via website, social media and email correspondences.

My WBBL06

I was fortunate to be selected as part of the second group of match officials in the WBBL06 hub at Sydney Olympic Park in November 2020. Travelling from a Covid safe zone in Adelaide to somewhat of a hot spot in Sydney was surreal, but Cricket Australia ensured all precautions were taken and I was lucky to be quite separate on my flight from other passengers in what was my first since travelling to Melbourne for the Women's T20 World Cup final in March. Requirements to enter the hub were also cautious, and I was temperature and Covid tested on arrival and not allowed to mingle with others until my negative result. The hub life was really well thought out, although it was clear that those who had been there since the beginning of the tournament were becoming tired with the monotonous daily routine. We were able to go for walks outside of the two hotel complex and there were not many people around Olympic Park at the time, which made social distancing quite straightforward. It was also possible to walk down to the nearby mangroves and national park area, which often made for interesting conversations amongst the match officials and kept everyone sane, rather than being stuck solely within the hub itself. Some gym visits were also possible, although NRL Origin matches and the Covid outbreak in Adelaide meant there were some pauses. Despite being in Sydney for 11 days when the Adelaide outbreak occurred, myself and a few others in the hub were locked back down in our rooms and re-tested. Fortunately, I was able to come out of that lockdown fairly quickly once it was realised I had been isolating prior to my departure from Adelaide, which meant I had essentially done my 14 days already.

It wasn't long after that experience that I was informed that I had been selected to stay on an extra week as part of the group of match officials for the finals series. I knew I had had a strong tournament, but this opportunity was still very exciting as it was my first in a national tournament. After enjoying the first semi-final as 4th umpire, I stood on field with National Panel Umpire Tony Wilds in the second semi-final between Sydney Thunder and Brisbane Heat at North Sydney Oval. It was great having a home crowd and for a moment there it seemed like the Heat might chase down the Thunder's 143 when Laura Kimmince started hitting out. However, the Thunder fought back and managed to hold on to make the final. It was a great experience to stand with Tony, who has a very calm demeanour on field.

There were then two days before the final, during which I was told I was selected to stand on field in that match with Claire Polosak. This marked the first time two female umpires were on field in a national final, which was an incredible honour and completely unexpected for me. I was happy just being in the finals group of match officials and had assumed I would be 4th for the final given the calibre of those around me! Having Shabnim Ismail open the bowling at my end was incredible and I had a front row seat to one of the finest fast bowling spells in WBBL history. I also had my first experience of 'umpire cam', which after getting used to the additional weight was not noticeable. Although the contest wasn't quite what the final was hoping for, we were both tested in our decision making and felt part of the game throughout. On our return to the hub, it was mostly quiet with officials and support staff enjoying some well deserved down time and it was wonderful to be congratulated by Thunder young gun Pheobe Litchfield, who took the time out of celebrations to comment how inspiring it was to have two female umpires in the final. It was early to bed for me as I had the early flight home, although I am told the Thunder were awake long enough to welcome the sunrise! I thoroughly enjoyed the hub experience, although I am not sure if it is something I would want to do too often if avoidable.
