

MINUTES OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 8th August 2018

1. Open Meeting

A minute's silence was held as a show of respect to Terry Page who passed away since our last AGM.

3. Apologies

Apologies were received from Peter Raftery, Jeff King, Lawrence Key, Tony Ey, Chris Hollard, Kumar Chandrakumar, Kim Perrin, Peter Weddell, Steve Warren, Geoff Behn, John Biddiss, Alan Croft, Adrian Drosd and Seb Todd.

4. Minutes of 2017 AGM

The Minutes of the 2017 Annual Meeting as presented in the Annual Report were adopted on the motion of John Ketley and seconded by Craig Thomas.

5. Business arising from 2017 AGM

There was no business arising from the 2017 AGM.

14. Election of Office Bearers

15. Election of 3 Committee Members

After a secret ballot – Mike Lake, Shane Roberts and Craig Thomas were elected for two years. There were two nominees - Adrian Drosd and Tony Trist. After a secret ballot Tony Trist was elected.

16. Life Member Nomination

We have no nominations for Life Membership.

17. SA Cricket Umpiring Manager's Report

Michial advised that Sarah's report is in the Annual Report for all to read and thanked Sarah for all that she does for SACUSA.

18. Subscriptions

The Committee has decided that our membership fees will remain at \$100.00 this season. Lynton moved that the fee structure as presented be adopted and seconded by Terry Murch and after a vote of the members the motion was passed.

19. Honoraria

Lynton advised that the Committee proposed that the honorariums for next season remain at their current amounts. This was moved by Lynton Donisthorpe, seconded by Tim Pellew and passed.

20. Auditors

Lynton advised that the Committee proposed that the Auditors for next season be Jeff King and Bob Woods. This was moved by Lynton Donisthorpe, seconded by Don Bills and passed.

21. General Business

- a. Tony Trist advised that the Committee has developed a flyer that is provided to new umpires. They have also developed a Social Media Policy and a Privacy Policy which will be distributed and added to the SACUSA website.
- b. Tony Trist and Lynton Donisthorpe gave a brief overview of Easter 2019. Lynton will be the coordinator for SACUSA and he will be working closely with VCAUSA. There will be more information provided as it comes to hand. Tony introduced Dhaval Bhatt as Captain and advised that Mick Aworth is the coach and they will arrange training and practice games.
- c. Tony advised that we are currently working with SACA on a digital Honour Board to be used at Karen Rolton
- d. Don Bills advised that Bruce Compton has been admitted to a nursing home due to the onset of dementia.
- e. Ed Branson thanked Tony Trist on his time and the way he has handled himself during some difficult times.
- f. Terry Murch raised that there was a possibility of the President losing his position and that was not a good thing. This was confirmed as a possibility and it was decided by those present that the Committee should look at changing the positions of the Committee to re-institute the position of Immediate Past President. The motion was moved by Bob Woods seconded by Tim Pellew and passed on a show of hands. Neil Ricketts raised that there should be a scorer position on the committee and this was endorsed by the meeting as well. With this in mind and some other changes that the Committee was looking at as well it was decided that the Committee will review our constitution.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

(Ed Branson)



SACUSA Members,

It is with great pleasure that I present the President's report of our Association's business for the 2018-2019 year.

From the start of the season, it was exciting to move the venue for our association meetings to Karen Rolton Oval, Narnungga (Park 25). Whilst there have been some "teething" challenges, and there is now considerably more work for our Social sub-Committee, I believe that members have welcomed the move. We are learning how to use the facility effectively. There will be the occasional delay with meeting start times when Karen Rolton Oval is used on the same day. However, I am sure that we will be able to adapt and work with other users.

The induction of two new members to the SACUSA Hall of Fame occurred in November of 2018 and is detailed in the History report.

Another successful Bradman Medal presentation night was held in March and members of our executive were again involved in some of the preliminary planning. It must be acknowledged that the vast majority of the organising is carried out by SACA staff and we thank them for their continued efforts in running such a prestigious event. SACUSA supplies the medals, which Craig Thomas continues to organise.

In April we ventured to Melbourne for our biennial Easter gathering with our Victorian friends and colleagues. Our hopes were high that we could regain the Crocket Shield, but after a wonderful game in which Craig Thomas nearly recorded a rare century, the Victorians managed to hang on for a win. We did retrieve the Butler trophy on the Sunday, so we did not return empty handed. Again, the Victorian hospitality was exceptional, and we thank them for it. In 2021, we will host the Easter event in what will be the 90th anniversary of the first Crocket Shield. I hope that we will be able to pull out all stops to involve many more of our membership and make this a truly memorable event. Details of the various match award winners are included in the Easter report. The executive has written to Dhaval Bhatt to thank him for his outstanding captaincy of the team, not only on the field, but at training and, particularly in the way he spoke at the Easter dinners. His dignity and professionalism was widely commented upon.

Our annual Presentation Dinner was a great success. Ben Hook again compered with his usual wit and understanding of cricket officiating and the meal and venue at the Adelaide Pavilion were excellent. Special thanks are due to Darran and Angela Swain and Craig and Kristen Thomas for the organisation and choreographing of the evening and to Bruce Stribley for ensuring that all the awards were present and correct. Congratulations to all the award winners, a detailed list of award winners can be found elsewhere in this annual report. I took the initiative of accepting a long-standing invitation to attend the VCAUSA Presentation Dinner. It was a great night, very similar to our own, and I was warmly welcomed.

This past season has seen a steady increase in scorer involvement in our association. Six clubs have taken up the offer of having 4 of their scorers join and each scorer, once their identity is known has been provided with a name badge, Scorer Handbook and pencil case with the SACUSA logo. We are in ongoing discussions with SACA about providing various levels of scorer training, including integrating scorers more with ongoing umpire training

It was with great regret that your executive accepted the resignation of Mike Lake for health reasons. Mike will continue to work with Tony Trist on development of a new website and will continue with the project he initiated to identify the order in which umpires were appointed to 1st Grade cricket. This will enable all First-grade umpires to be presented with a numbered cap in the near future. We thank Mike for his service and ongoing involvement and wish him well.

In 2017, SACA initiated a comprehensive Strategic Plan for all forms of cricket across the whole of South Australia with a residential conference involving about 100 key stakeholders at Hahndorf. The project is called Cricket Connects and it is "a program of work to make South Australian cricket - through its clubs and stakeholders - the most fun, family-friendly, inclusive and community connected of any sport in Australia. Cricket Connects captures six interdependent projects which set out to:

- Improve communications and relationships between all sectors of SA cricket, across all levels;
- Ensure that relevant information is more accessible to the SA cricket community;
- Provide mechanisms for self-guided development of club officials, coaches, players and parents

- Allow more streamlined competition management and compelling pathway and non-pathway competitions; and to
- Promote the Spirit of Cricket across all sectors of SA cricket"

Already, websites are in development to assist club administrators, coaches and participants, detailed and comprehensive facility planning is being undertaken with a view to a 10-year masterplan emerging, additional funding to clubs has been made available, rationalisation of playing conditions across associations is in development and various Spirit of Cricket initiatives have begun. When we consider that Cricket Connects is setting out to facilitate cricket across every association in the state, city and country, to be inclusive all forms of cricket including Blind, Hearing Impaired, Intellectually Impaired and Indoor Cricket, the comprehensiveness of the project can be clearly seen. Expect to hear much more of Cricket Connects as further implementation is rolled out.

Recently, a very successful Strategic Planning Day was held at Adelaide Oval. We welcomed Nathan Magill for the morning session and Daniel Goodwin and Sarah Fry for the full day. Their input was extremely helpful and assisted with giving an overview of future SACA and Cricket Australia directions and identifying ways in which SACUSA can develop to build on existing relationships. Colin Shearing facilitated the day and his professional guidance was very much appreciated. A Mission Statement and a Vision Statement were developed, our core values were identified and a SWOT analysis enabled us to begin the process of selecting short and medium term gaols. Shortly, all members will be invited to ratify the approach taken so far and to participate in the ongoing process. We hope to have a detailed Strategic Plan in place by the end of next season

Throughout the year in Sticky Wicket and at our Presentation dinner, the milestones that members have achieved during the season have been reported. I congratulate you all. Similarly, congratulations to all who were appointed to the many carnivals during the season and to those appointed to finals. Grand Final appointees are reported elsewhere in this Annual Report.

I wish to formally acknowledge the cooperative relationship that exists between SACUSA and the SACA particularly through the contributions that Nathan Magill, Daniel Goodwin and Sarah Fry make to the way in which cricket in general and Premier cricket in particular is organised and run. Over the last few years, considerable changes have occurred in the complexity of the cricket competitions in our State and in the ways in which officials, particularly umpires are prepared and trained. The winter training for umpires that has been increased this year has added to this and been welcomed. Nathan, Daniel and Sarah are creative while welcoming new ideas, diligent and professional in all that they do in ensuring that cricket runs smoothly. We thank them sincerely for their efforts and approach to their tasks.

It remains for me to thank my fellow members of the executive. Darran Swain has brought energy, enthusiasm and many new ideas and has been a wonderful vice President, Michial Farrow, as Secretary, and Lynton Donisthorpe as Treasurer and also Easter Coordinator continue to give outstanding and much appreciated service to SACUSA. Tony Trist has pioneered a new role as Membership Coordinator with great diligence and attention to detail and is working on developing a new SACUSA website, Bruce Stribley continues to supervise ordering and control of property in his own inimitable way and Craig Thomas was actively involved in the Social sub-Committee under the leadership of Darran Swain, particularly with organisation of the Bradman Medal and Presentation Dinner as well as active engagement with the Crocket Shield team. Shane Roberts was involved on the Social sub-Committee particularly with meeting night preparation and catering and Michael Williamson was involved in the Easter cricket team. I thank them all for their contributions and support.

At the last SACUSA AGM, your executive was directed to consider the re-establishment of a role of Immediate Past President as well as having a dedicated scorer representative. Whilst these will be reviewed as part of our strategic review, the fact that there are so many Past Presidents on the executive suggests that the former is not necessary and the experience of VCAUSA, with its dedicated scorer position that is often not able to be filled, suggests that the latter might prove to be too restrictive. Of course, we actively encourage scorers to put their names forward for election.

Finally, I thank you, the members of SACUSA for your involvement in SACUSA activities and ongoing encouragement. Best wishes for the 2019/2010 season.

Mr President and Members of SACUSA.

I would like to present to you my report for the 2018/2019 season at this Annual General Meeting of the South Australian Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association.

We have had a very busy year on the social side of things. The season was launched at the National Wine Centre. During the season, we held the Christmas Meeting, cricket matches against VCAUSA and Adelaide Cricket Club, Bowling Night, Bradman Medal and concluded with our Presentation Dinner. More information on these events can be found in the Social Convenor's Report.

I would like to thank SACA for its generosity in allowing us to use the facilities at Karen Rolton Pavilion for our monthly meetings, and our Social Committee for our pre-meeting meals throughout the season. This has enabled our members to have an enjoyable experience at our meetings.

The season once again climaxed with the Bradman Medal Dinner Presentation. I would like to congratulate all the medal winners, including Jake Brown of Kensington Cricket Club, on winning the Bradman Medal and Tabatha Saville of Northern Districts Cricket Club on winning the Karen Rolton Medal. I would also like to take this opportunity to congratulate the 2019 SACA Premier Cricket Umpire of the Year, Craig Thomas, on another fine season.

Our season concluded with the Presentation Dinner, held at The Adelaide Pavilion on South Terrace. I would like to congratulate all the worthy winners on the night, including Peter Weddell on winning the John Wilson Award and Raelene Woods on winning the Joyce McMenamin Trophy. These two winners were chosen by the Executive Committee from a fine selection of nominees for their contribution to our association and cricket in South Australia.

Congratulations to all our members on the high standard of umpiring displayed throughout the year and to all those who umpired finals. The great contributions of our members, however, have not been restricted to Premier Grade Cricket alone. Simon Fry has continued to represent himself and the association with great distinction at the higher levels. Whilst Craig Thomas, Eloise Sheridan and Harsimran Singh formed our State Panel and successfully officiated in WNCL, WBBL and Futures League competitions. They also undertook fourth umpire duties at BBL matches.

During the season Eloise Sheridan and Mary Waldron became the first female umpiring team to officiate in a West End Premier Cricket 1st Grade match. Eloise also made history when she stepped onto the field with Claire Polosak for the WBBL match between the Adelaide Strikers and Melbourne Stars. This was the first time two female on-field umpires have officiated a professional cricket match in Australia. A special mention should be made of Simon Fry, Lawrence Key and Neil Ricketts who all officiated in their 500th game during the season, well done.

I would like to thank our wonderful sponsors, who have been so generous throughout the year – SACA, Coverdrive Couriers, Parkinson Corporate, Maid of Auckland Hotel and 1834 Hotels - and I ask that we support these companies that support us.

To my fellow members of the Executive Committee, Sarah Fry, Nathan Magill, Daniel Goodwin and Catherine Brown, at SACA, thank you all for your help and support throughout the season. Finally, to the members of SACUSA, I thank you for your support, and I look forward to your continued support in the up-coming season.

TREASURER'S REPORT

(Lynton Donisthorpe)



Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

It is with great pleasure that I present to you the Treasurer's Report of our Association's business for the 2018-2019 financial year.

Balance Sheet Summary

This year has seen us deliver a moderate deficit, well below the significant deficit that we had forecast. This was largely due to an unexpected Government Grant and under expenditure on a number of events. Receipts for the year of \$60,755.83 and payments of \$63,094.52, delivered an end of financial year balance in our working account of \$20,456.22 and a loss of \$2,338.69 for the year.

Membership

Membership numbers increased again in 2018/19 to 143 Full Members (132 in 2017/18) and Associate Membership was down a little to 8 (11 in 2017/18), Life Members are not included in these figures. The club scorer initiative, now in its 3rd season, was taken up by 3 clubs this year (2 new and 1 renewing) bringing the number of full scorer members to 22.

Sponsorship

Sponsorship income was the same as 2017/18 with SACA continuing as a major sponsor and Coverdrive Couriers continuing the fantastic financial support they have provided to SACUSA for a very long time, on behalf of members, I thank them yet again for their significant contribution.

Budget Comparison

Our Loss of \$2,338.69 was significantly below our budgeted/predicted Loss of \$6,730.00. The most significant contributing factors to this were an unanticipated Government Grant (\$3,000 above budget), below expected Bradman Medal costs (\$1,595.00 below budget), due to lower dinner guest and medal costs, below expected Presentation Dinner costs (\$1,274.27 below budget), below expected Easter subsidies (\$1,313.42 below budget) due to lower than expected attendance and above expected member income (\$725.33 above budget). We did have increased costs in some areas, largely related to property (totalling \$3,243.42 above budget), as we provided new member badges for all members and purchased additional clothing (some of which are held in stock for future sale) and above anticipated expenditure on history items (\$756.26 above budget) related to the Hall of Fame induction event. Remaining items were around budget estimates, allowing for the expected fluctuations. The EC adopt a conservative approach to budgeting, as we believe it is the prudent method of managing member's funds. This policy often results in financial outcomes considerably more advantageous, than those budgeted, which is evident in this, and recent financial years.

Trust Accounts

The Gladstone Jones and George McDonagh trust funds (held in Westpac Community Solutions Cash Reserve Account) realised interest as the only income again this year. We had total withdrawals of \$139.16 (\$69.58 from each account) for Easter Trophies (the reason the money was bequeathed to SACUSA). Interest income for the year in the account was \$3.23, leaving a final account balance of \$1,200.99, split between the two funds as follows: Jones \$572.16 and McDonagh \$628.83.

Overview of Current Financial Position

SACUSA had a better than anticipated financial year this year, and although a loss, we are still in a strong financial position. As a not-for-profit organisation, we do not need to make profits, but do require funds to provide us with future security and to support members and Association goals and initiatives. We fall a little short of the accepted guideline for sporting clubs and Associations (i.e. funds for 2 years with no income), while difficult to assess, we are around this figure and easily able to adjust our annual expenditure to allow for any unexpected financial issues, should they arise.

Glad Jones and George McDonagh Memorial Trust Funds







George McDonagh

As a part of the biennial cricket match against the Victorian Cricket Association Umpires and Scorers Association, trophies are awarded to the best performed South Australian players for overall performance and fielding. These awards are made possible by trust funds held by the South Australian Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association from monies donated by former members, Gladstone Jones and George McDonagh.

The first fund, the Glad Jones Memorial Trust Fund, was established in March 1976 with a donation of \$150.00 from Mr. Gladstone Jones for a trophy to be awarded to the best performed player representing South Australia. Two years later Mr. George McDonagh made a similar donation, establishing the George McDonagh Memorial Trust Fund to enable an award to be made to the best performed fielder during these matches.

The donations remain invested at the discretion of the SACUSA Committee, however, if a decision was taken to discontinue the matches in the future, the funds and any interest earned was to be donated to the National Heart Foundation. After the establishment of both funds the Executive Committee of the South Australian Cricket Umpires Association was empowered to use the interest earned from both funds to award the trophies after each match. An increase to the capital invested of \$200.00 was made to each fund during the late 1980's from interest already earned to ensure that a sound basis for interest earning existed and therefore the continuation of the awards.

SACA STATE UMPIRING LEADER'S REPORT

Mr President and Members of SACUSA,



During the 2018-19 season we had great success with many stories and achievements to reflect on. I offer my congratulations to everyone who excelled, accomplished their goals and contributed to the success of umpiring and scoring on and off the field.

It was another busy season for all involved where we embraced SACA's inaugural spirit of cricket round and a large number of appointments were covered across many different competitions, carnivals and associations.

There was also an increase in training and development opportunities offered. This included the season launch, annual seminar, laws study nights, specific panel training nights and the Behind the Bails evening where ICC Match Officials, Ranjan Madugalle, Kumar Dharmasena, Chris Gaffaney and Gerard Abood joined us to share their experiences and stories.

Training also reached a new level as we introduced the use of video recording glasses to provide a different training tool and feedback to our Panel 1 umpires.

Craig Thomas, Eloise Sheridan and Harsimran Singh formed our State Panel and successfully officiated in WNCL, WBBL and Futures League competitions. They also undertook fourth umpire duties at BBL matches with Craig and Harsimran travelling to Darwin for the WBBL.

Eloise umpired in the inaugural National Premier Cricket T20 Competition and, along with Mary Waldron became the first female umpiring team to officiate in a West End Premier Cricket 1st Grade match. Both umpires performed well during this match and are continuing to lead the way for female umpires in the state. Eloise also made history at Adelaide Oval in December when she stepped onto the field with Claire Polosak for the WBBL match between the Adelaide Strikers and Melbourne Stars. This was the first time two female on-field umpires have officiated a professional cricket match in Australia, making the game a significant milestone for Australian cricket. Eloise was also named as a finalist for the South Australian Sports Official of the Year at the annual South Australian Sports Awards.

Giorgio Profiris and Eloise travelled to umpire in the Northern Territory and Dhaval Bhatt travelled to Melbourne as part of our umpire exchange program. Dhaval umpired in the Victorian Premier Cricket Men's First competition in a two-day match during February with Scott Olufson. Adam Hawking from Victoria and Dennis Chaplin from New South Wales came to Adelaide to officiate in our Premier Cricket competition.

During the season Simon Fry stood in his 50th Australian Domestic T20 Match in the fixture between the Hobart Hurricanes and the Sydney Thunder at Blundstone Arena. At the International level, Simon has stood in 16 T20 Internationals, and became the fourth Australian umpire to stand on-field in 50 Domestic T20 matches. It was great to have Simon involved in our training sessions and the Redbacks League throughout the season to provide some valuable insight from his experiences.

Simon was also appointed as a mentor for the Under 19 Male National Championships held in Adelaide with Daryl Harper, Steve Davis and John Biddiss the appointed Match Referees. This highlights the excellent coaching resources and experience we have within our ranks.

While South Australian cricket officials were busy during the 2018/19 season making their own history, SACUSA's cricket year began with the presentation of Hall of Fame status bestowed on two amazing individuals – Rita Artis and Steve Davis – at a Sunday event held in their honour in November. SACUSA President, Edward Branson, was instrumental in seeing this initiative delivered before the Christmas break, and recounts the day in his recollection below:

"After the announcement of Rita Artis and Steve Davis as the latest inductees into the SACUSA Hall of Fame at the Presentation Dinner in March 2018, it was with considerable excitement that some 80 people gathered at the Adelaide Cricket Club on Sunday 25th November 2018. Normally, inductions occur at our Presentation Dinners, but the special event was timed to coincide with Steve Davis being in Australia. Both Rita and Steve expressed their delight and feelings of honour and pride at the recognition the Hall of Fame induction signified. It was delightful to see another SACUSA ally recognised for their behind-the-scenes support of our organisation this year, when Raelene Woods was named as the 2018/19 'Joyce McMenamin Trophy' winner. Presented to unofficial supporters of significant SACUSA contributors for previously unrecognised service that has been vital to SACUSA's existence, the award was introduced to capture the dedication shown to SACUSA by individuals who aren't otherwise acknowledged. Like any volunteer group, SACUSA would not have been able to thrive for its 100+ years without the support of our 'unsung heroes'.

While the SACUSA history research has slowed somewhat during the past twelve months, due to a number of competing responsibilities, there is one initiative I'd like to request that our members consider during the 2019/20 season. Video is a powerful tool that resonates with many during the early part of this 21st century. It would be so fantastic to record who our officials are this season – and how better for future generations to see them than through video? During your initial matches in the coming season, please consider including a request to video your cricket officiating colleagues introducing themselves and the club they're from and film your officiating team – umpires and scorers – working together at the start of the day. This is an easy way to get to know your colleagues and record who our 2019/20 officials are. Then please send the video in a message to SACUSA via Facebook, or email, and we can collate the videos together for our season recap. No video will be made public without us contacting the individuals for permission – and obviously people have the option to decline being videoed when you ask them for an introduction. Photos, also, are another option – and if you think this is an awful idea, let us know that too. SACUSA needs to know how you want our history captured.

S.A.C.U.S.A. HALL OF FAME

Selection Criteria and Guidelines for Induction to the SACUSA Hall of Fame

- Rule 1. Candidacy is open to all umpires and scorers meeting the selection criteria who behaved in a manner which was conducive with the spirit and objectives of SACUSA.
- Rule 2. The SACUSA Executive Committee must appoint a Selection Panel of three impartial and independent individuals who decide on the successful inductees.
- Rule 3. The SACUSA Executive Committee is charged with the task of presenting a shortlist of possible inductees to the Selection Panel.
- Rule 4. Candidates must have made a very significant contribution to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia over an extended period of time. A candidate's worthiness is purely at the discretion of the Selection Sub-committee in order to be considered for nomination.
- Rule 5. Candidates must have demonstrated an exceptional dedication to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia and must not have illustrated behavior that would suggest a conflict with the ideals held by SACUSA during the era that the candidate actively contributed.
- Rule 6. Candidates must not have been actively umpiring or scoring within the cricketing environment for at least two years prior to nomination.
- Rule 7. The Hall of Fame must be reviewed at least every two years.



PREMIER CRICKET AWARD WINNERS

- Actual cricket ability displayed.
- Players attitude towards the game.
- Players demeanor, behavior and dress.

THE BRADMAN MEDAL



During season 1957/58 three SACUA Umpires, John McMenamin, Jack Kierse and Gordon Seymour, were enjoying a quiet drink after a SACUA meeting at the Hotel Adelaide in Pirie Street, when the 'idea' of an award for the best A Grade District Cricketer was proposed.

The original award, first made after season 1958/59, was based on one vote per game for the best player during an 'A' Grade match.

The first presentation dinner was held at the Seven Stars Hotel in Angas Street, Adelaide and was attended by approximately 30 umpires. Votes were counted during the dinner and, at the conclusion of the count, joint winners Ian McLachlan and Brian Quigley were announced. Neither of the winners were in attendance and taxis were sent to their homes to bring them to the dinner to receive their award.

During season 1976/77 it was decided that the District Cricketer Award should be renamed as the Bradman Medal and Sir Donald Bradman was approached for his approval. "The Don" agreed and said that he would be honoured to have the award named after him. The presentation of this prestigious award has continued and the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner is now recognised as the pinnacle of any cricket season in South Australia. Season 2007/08 celebrated 50 years since the inception of the District Cricketer Award/Bradman Medal. To celebrate this occasion winners (or family members) of the District Cricketer Award from 1956/57 to 1975/76 were presented with a Bradman Medal at the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner on 19th March 2008. Also on the night three players who lost on a count-back were awarded Bradman Medals.
