20. Adoption of the Child Safety policies and codes

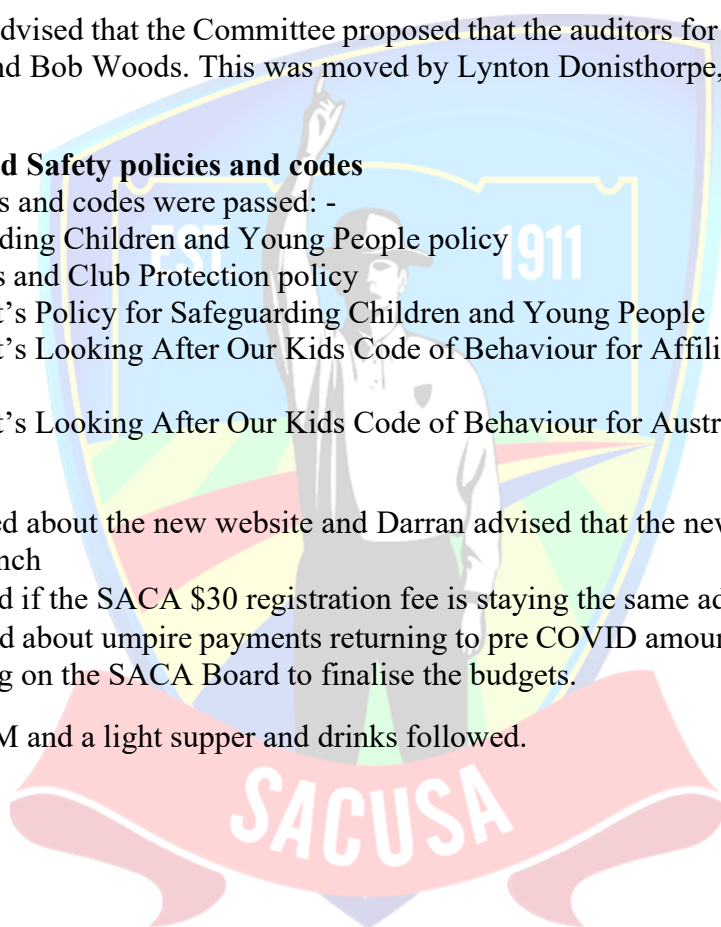
The following policies and codes were passed: -

PRESIDENT'S REPORT (Darran Swain)



SACUSA Members,

It is with great pleasure that I present my second President's report of our Association for the 2021-2022 year – a year in which the South Australian Cricket Umpires & Scorers Association continued to support the growth of cricket in SA and across the nation.

We started the season with Craig Thomas being appointed to the role of SACA Umpire Administrator and Development Coach. A huge thank you to Craig and Sarah Fry for all the hard work throughout the season, it goes without saying, it is very much appreciated.

This season has been fantastic with little disruption from Covid, the occasional umpire and/or teams had covid or was a close contact. However, this didn't stop the competition and it was great to see we had a full season. Thank you to all the umpires, scorers, and umpire coaches for your assistance and understanding. Well done to all umpires and scorers for a great season, and from all reports you have all performed very well. Congratulations on another fantastic season.

In August, the 2021/2022 umpiring season launch was held at the Majestic Roof Garden Hotel in Adelaide where we were advised of dates of when the season will start and any changes for the upcoming season. SACUSA was given the opportunity to launch its new website. I would like to thank Neil Poulton from Citadel IT (a SACUSA sponsor) for developing and maintaining our website.

Our State-wide Umpire Seminar was held in September at West Beach. This annual pre-season training and preparation opportunity was generously co-ordinated by our Cricket Operations & Match Officials Manager Sarah Fry and SACA Umpire Administrator & Development Coach Craig Thomas. Throughout the sessions we heard from Simon Fry and Simon Taufel in how to prepare for games etc. What a fantastic seminar with great information and advice.

This past season has seen an increase in scorer involvement in our association. Seven clubs have taken up the offer of having their scorers join and each scorer then gets provided with a name badge, scorer handbook and pencil case with the SACUSA logo. Over the past few years, the SACUSA Scorer's subcommittee, led by Lesley Quaini have done a wonderful job in promoting scoring throughout SACUSA and SACA. They have developed a Level 1 Accreditation which is now online for anyone wishing to complete the course and become a scorer. The Level 2 course will be online shortly so please look out for this. These courses can be found on our SACUSA website. We are currently having discussions with SACA about providing various levels of scorer training, including integrating scorers more with ongoing umpire training.

There have been many examples of noteworthy appointments during the season, especially those umpires who stood in their 1st T20 1st Grade game. I would like to initially offer my heartiest congratulations to Peter George who made his 1st Grade debut in Round 12 – Feb 19th & 26th Southern v Prospect. Congratulate Eloise Sheridan in another standout year, where we saw Eloise stand in WBBL & BBL games, umpired her 1st Test Match between Australia & England in Canberra and then later in the Women's World Cup in New Zealand. We then watched Eloise take her position as an on-field umpire for the Semi Final game between England & South Africa. Eloise continues to strive in her umpiring and has recently been re-appointed to CA Supplementary Panel as well as the ICC Development Panel. SACUSA are very proud of Eloise's achievements, and we look forward to seeing Eloise more on the national and international stage in the near future.

Grand Finals are the goal for all teams each year, but they are also important for umpires. Congratulations to all the umpires and scorers that officiated in the final series throughout the season. Regardless of the situation, everyone can be successful if you put in time, effort, and hard work. Well done to all umpires and scorers on a fantastic season.

The Bradman Rolton Medal night was the same format as the previous year, a cocktail event. It was a wonderful night, where all players from all clubs and umpires could mingle and catch up with each other. Congratulations to all the winners, in particular to Craig Thomas for winning SACA Umpire of the Year.

Easter saw us, due to COVID, cancel the Crockett Shield match against the Victorians, however, this did not stop a group of umpires having a 'practise' match at Port Adelaide on Easter Saturday. We look forward to hosting the Crockett Shield next year at Easter against the Victorians.

Our Presentation Dinner was a great success attended by 80 members and partners. Ben Hook was unavailable this year, so we had the ever-reliable Darryl Harper as our MC who provided us with his insights and understanding of cricket officiating and topped off with his usual wit and humour. Special thanks to Craig and Kristen Thomas and Angela Swain for the organisation and choreographing of the evening and to Bruce Stribley for organising all the awards. Congratulations to all the award winners, a detailed list of award winners can be found elsewhere in the annual report.

Unfortunately, we say good-bye and thanks to 2 executive members who have decided not to nominate for the committee. Firstly, we thank Craig Thomas for his service to the committee. 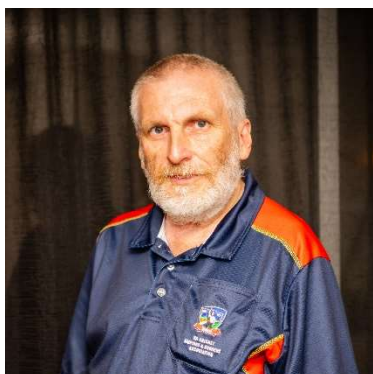

TREASURER'S REPORT

(Lynton Donisthorpe)



Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

It is with great pleasure that I present to you the Treasurer's Report of our Association's business for the 2021-2022 financial year.

Balance Sheet Summary

This year we have delivered a small surplus, due largely to not being able to hold Easter as planned, which was considerably above our forecasts (see Budget Comparison section for full details). Receipts for the year of \$39,010.80 and payments of \$38,010.82, provided a Working Account end of financial year balance of \$28,555.30 and a surplus for the year of \$999.98.

Membership

Membership numbers remained steady in 2021/22 with 128 Full Members (127 in 2020/21) and 5 Associate Members (4 in 2020/21), Life Members are not included in these figures. The club scorer initiative, now in its 6th season, was higher, with 7 clubs participating this year (6 in 2020/21) and 30 scorer Full Members via this initiative.

Sponsorship

Sponsorship income was the same as 2020/21 with SACA continuing as a major sponsor and Coverdrive Couriers continuing the fantastic financial support they have provided to SACUSA for a very long time. On behalf of members, I thank them both for their significant contribution yet again.

Budget Comparison

Our Surplus of \$999.98 was significantly above our budgeted/predicted Loss of \$4,275. This was again mainly due to the cancellation of the Easter Event in 2022 and the less than expected Bradman Medal event costs (\$1,110 below budget). Property for Re-sale costs were higher than expected (\$2,802.65 above budget) due to the engagement of a new off field clothing supplier and the subsequent much wider use and distribution of SACUSA clothing (note that we are carrying some of these purchases as stock for next season). General Meeting food costs increased with this item over budget by \$525.80. Remaining items were largely around budget estimates when allowing for normal fluctuations. The EC continued to adopt our conservative budgeting policy as a responsible methodology for managing members funds.

Trust Accounts

The Gladstone Jones and George McDonagh trust funds (held in Westpac Community Solutions Cash Reserve Account) realised interest as the only income again. As Easter was not held, we had no withdrawals from the account for Easter Trophies (the reason the money was bequeathed to SACUSA). Interest income for the year in the account was \$0.06 which is very low due to low bank interest rates. This left a final account balance of \$1,202.63, split between the two funds as follows: Jones \$573.03 and McDonagh \$629.60.

Overview of Current Financial Position

SACUSA had a better than anticipated financial year again this year. We anticipate having to use some of our current surplus funds for the coming year, with the cancelled 2022 Easter now planned for 2023 and the need to make it a very successful event as well as increasing costs we are experiencing. Although the threat of cancelled cricket seasons etc. due of COVID19 seems to be behind us, we are still in financial uncertain times and the strong financial position we have built over the past decade gives us confidence we can continue to thrive as an Association and provide services to members that they have come to expect well into the future.

Glad Jones and George McDonagh Memorial Trust Funds

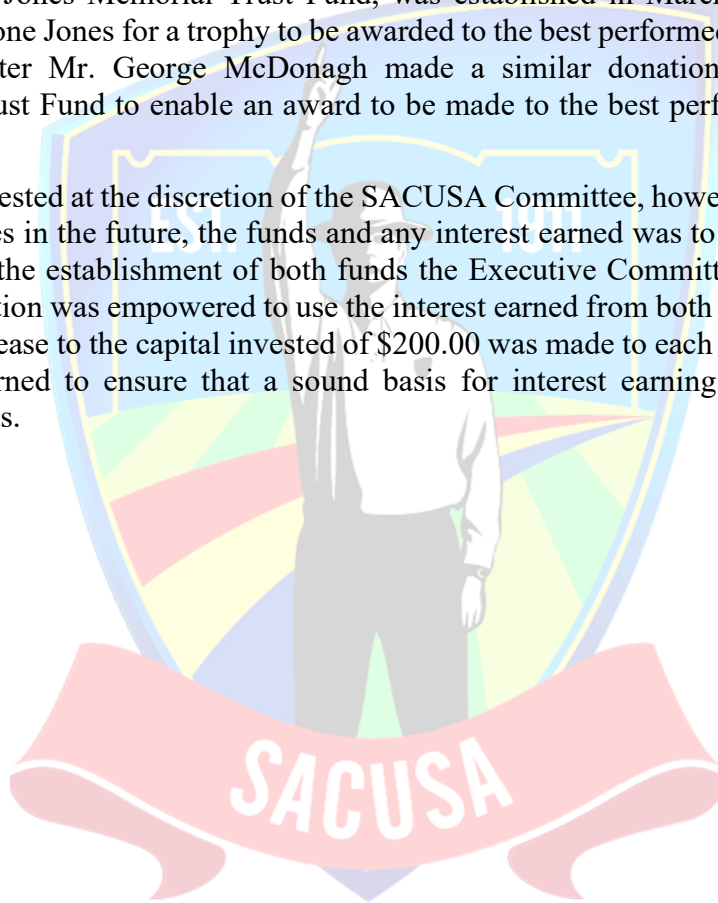

As a part of the biennial cricket match against the Victorian Cricket Association Umpires and Scorers Association, trophies are awarded to the best performed South Australian players for overall performance and fielding. These awards are made possible by trust funds held by the South Australian Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association from monies donated by former members, Gladstone Jones and George McDonagh.

The first fund, the Glad Jones Memorial Trust Fund, was established in March 1976 with a donation of \$150.00 from Mr. Gladstone Jones for a trophy to be awarded to the best performed player representing South Australia. Two years later Mr. George McDonagh made a similar donation, establishing the George McDonagh Memorial Trust Fund to enable an award to be made to the best performed fielder during these matches.

The donations remain invested at the discretion of the SACUSA Committee, however, if a decision was taken to discontinue the matches in the future, the funds and any interest earned was to be donated to the National Heart Foundation. After the establishment of both funds the Executive Committee of the South Australian Cricket Umpires Association was empowered to use the interest earned from both funds to award the trophies after each match. An increase to the capital invested of \$200.00 was made to each fund during the late 1980's from interest already earned to ensure that a sound basis for interest earning existed and therefore the continuation of the awards.

Mr. President and Members,

The 2021/22 season was a very productive period for the scorer subcommittee, focusing on Scorer Training, Development and Pathway opportunities, especially Scorer Accreditation, with 3 levels identified i.e. Community, Representative and High Performance. Level 1 Community Accreditation was completed and has been available online since its release at a Scorers Training Session in September 2021. The accreditation process has been well publicised through SACUSA's website and SACA's monthly Match Official Newsletters with over 50 scorers completing this level. Level 2 Representative Accreditation was started in February 2022, and we hope to have this level completed and available by the beginning of season 2022/23.

Another major project has been reviewing and updating the SACUSA's "Scorer Integration Paper, first written in 2011. The aim of SACUSA at that time was to be inclusive for ALL Match Day Officials. Scorers were not included/consulted during a game even though their role was essential to the smooth running and result of the game. The review process has identified what has and/or has not been achieved since its first publication. The paper is now being updated to reflect those changes e.g. Umpire/Scorer communication improvements; increases in Scorer memberships, training sessions and pathways; as well as Scorer recognition of achievements and milestones. However, some sections e.g. Recruitment and especially Renumeration, are still a work in progress.

Scorer memberships continued in season 2021/22 with 30 joining SACUSA. Thank you to Adelaide, Glenelg, Kensington, Port Adelaide, Prospect, Tea Tree Gully, and West Torrens for their continued support for both scorers and SACUSA. Once again thank you to all scorers, old and new, who have provided/maintained their scoring stats for this Annual Report.

SACA were able to increase their scorers 'pool', that were needed to cover all National and International games that occurred in South Australia during 2021/22. This provided excellent opportunities for many scorers who wished to extend their skills as well as developing pathways for higher performance.

Well done to all Match Officials on a great year. There were many achievements accomplished during the 2021-22 season and it was pleasing to see our group progress and further develop during this time.

The season was launched in August during an afternoon function at the Majestic Roof Garden Hotel. This followed with several umpire training nights and our annual seminar. We were treated to some fantastic guest speakers and presenters at these sessions including Simon Taufel, Paul Wilson, Simon Fry and Daryl Harper.

Congratulations to all Match Officials and well done on your achievements. Thank you for your commitment and dedication across the season and we look forward to what the future holds.

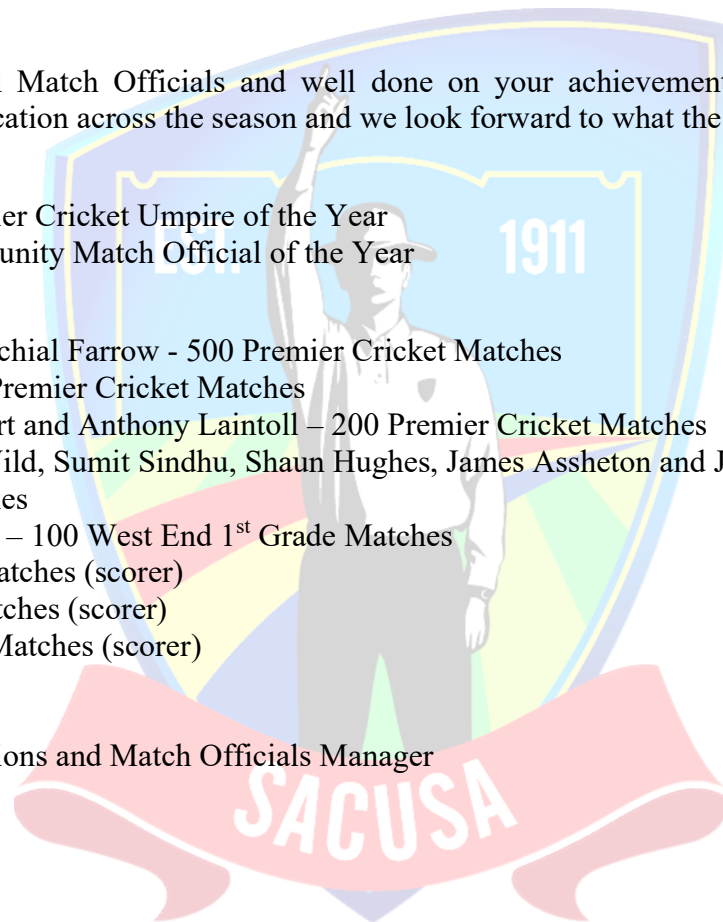

EASTER COMMITTEE REPORT (Lynton Donisthorpe)



Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

After considerable deliberation by both associations, the decision was made not to hold the Easter Event as planned, for the 2nd successive year in Adelaide 2022.

This was again due to the ongoing impacts of Coronavirus, largely the travel implications for the Victorians visiting SA. Although travel restrictions did not prevent the free movement of people this year (as they may did in 2021), the implications were still very evident. Stringent booking cancellations conditions and government-imposed isolation requirements in place for COVID positive cases represented significant logistical and financial implications for members who could not attend as well as both Associations (who had to carry the financial burden of cancellations). This situation again cast a significant shadow over the 2022 event, and it was for these reasons, both Associations agreed that once again it was not practical to proceed at this time. Reluctantly, at a joint meeting in January 2022, the very difficult decision was taken to again postpone the event for a further year. Subsequent discussions with the VCAUSA have decided to hold the 2023 Easter event & Crockett Shield match in Adelaide.

Of significance is that since the Easter Event's inception in 1931, this is only the 2nd period that the Crockett Shield and Easter event has not been held as scheduled (World War 2 being the first), both being very significant world events.

The Crockett Shield Match and Easter weekend is truly a great Australian Cricket tradition. The challenges it has faced in recent years, is just one in its long and illustrious history. It will endure, however both Associations are mindful that the extended "break" we have now had does place it at some risk and at our Joint Meeting in June 2022, both committees re-affirmed their commitment to making the 2023 event one of the most successful in its history.

Participation and enjoyment of members is the reason this event exists. On behalf of the executive committee, I urge all SACUSA members to plan to attend, at least some Easter Crockett Shield events when they return in Adelaide between Friday 7th and Monday 10th April 2023.

HISTORY COMMITTEE REPORT

Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

I am pleased to present the history report for season 2021/22. In the reports from the previous two seasons Kristen indicated we were heading into historic times. I wonder if she or anyone in our Association realised just how profound those words were to become. Hindsight tells us that, whilst there were disruptions to cricket in all facets, seasons were completed, premierships awarded and matches umpired to the normal high standard by our match

officials, congratulations to all involved for the flexibility and commitment shown. This could well be a major topic in the second edition of our book in 2111.

We were able to hold 2 history committee meetings during the season, with Kristen Thomas, Ed Branson, Max Bartlett, Bob Woods and Chris Hollard being the committee members. I believe the main achievement was the update to the list of first-class umpires who were/are SACUA/SACUSA members. The observant members will notice a new category added into the list and a change to an existing category. We have added in Women's Test and added Men's to the existing category. I am somewhat disappointed to advise that of the 8 Women's Tests played in Adelaide prior to 2010 we are unable to identify umpires for the match held at Kings College in January 1957, Australia v New Zealand. At this point I would like to thank Daryl Harper for his assistance in identifying many of those umpires and helping with the career span of many others.

The Centenary Book project is continuing, not as fast as we would like, but when Kristen presents a biography in its formatted style ready for inclusion into the book the attention to detail, research and passion is immediately apparent, and the time spent on it obvious. Research has been completed for the majority of the biographies, but it is the formatting which takes significant time. We press on.

Work has also been done by members outside of the history committee on a couple of fronts:

1. Mike Lake (whilst on the SACUSA Executive) researched so that numbers could be allocated to first grade umpires dating back to 1911. This research is yet to be obtained from Mike, but a significant amount has been completed.
2. Along similar lines Kurt Miegel has completed research on players who represented SACUA/SACUSA in Crocket Shield matches. The proposed outcome to this would be past players who wish to be able to pay for their number to be added on their Crocket Shield caps, with new players cap numbers to be provided.

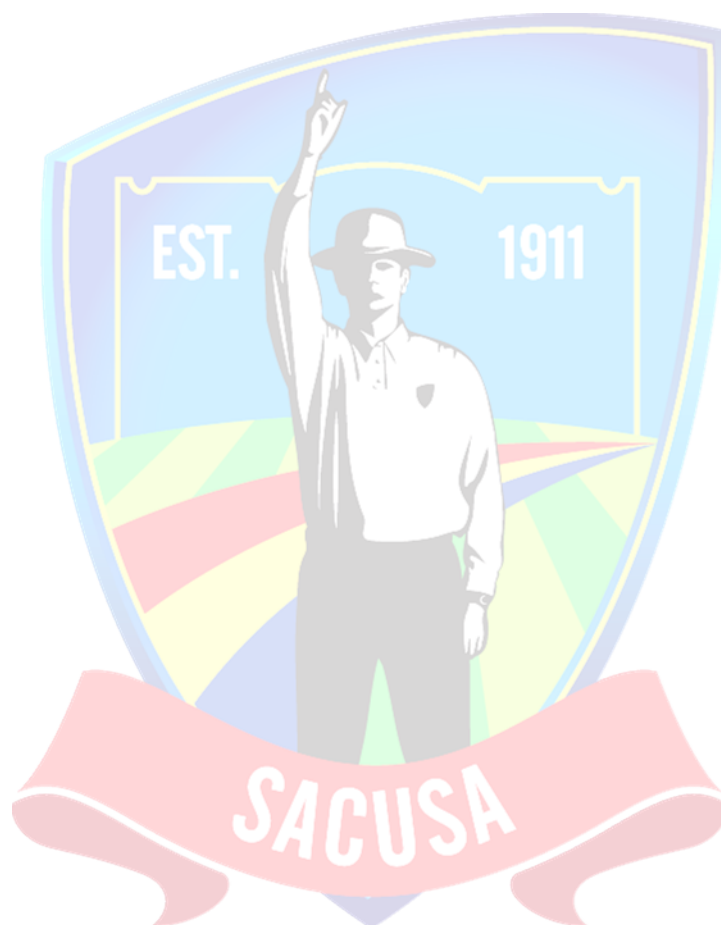

S.A.C.U.S.A. HALL OF FAME

Selection Criteria and Guidelines for Induction to the SACUSA Hall of Fame

- Rule 1. Candidacy is open to all umpires and scorers meeting the selection criteria who behaved in a manner which was conducive with the spirit and objectives of SACUSA.
- Rule 2. The SACUSA Executive Committee must appoint a Selection Panel of three impartial and independent individuals who decide on the successful inductees.
- Rule 3. The SACUSA Executive Committee is charged with the task of presenting a shortlist of possible inductees to the Selection Panel.
- Rule 4. Candidates must have made a very significant contribution to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia over an extended period of time. A candidate's worthiness is purely at the discretion of the Selection Sub-committee in order to be considered for nomination.
- Rule 5. Candidates must have demonstrated an exceptional dedication to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia and must not have illustrated behavior that would suggest a conflict with the ideals held by SACUSA during the era that the candidate actively contributed.
- Rule 6. Candidates must not have been actively umpiring or scoring within the cricketing environment for at least two years prior to **nomination**.
- Rule 7. The Hall of Fame must be reviewed at least every two years.

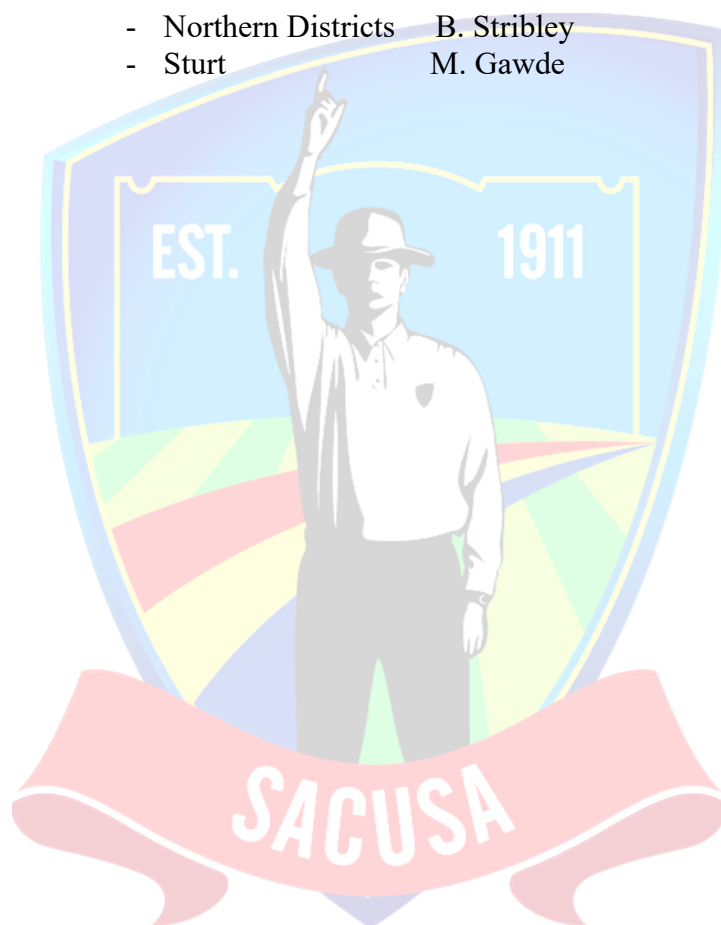

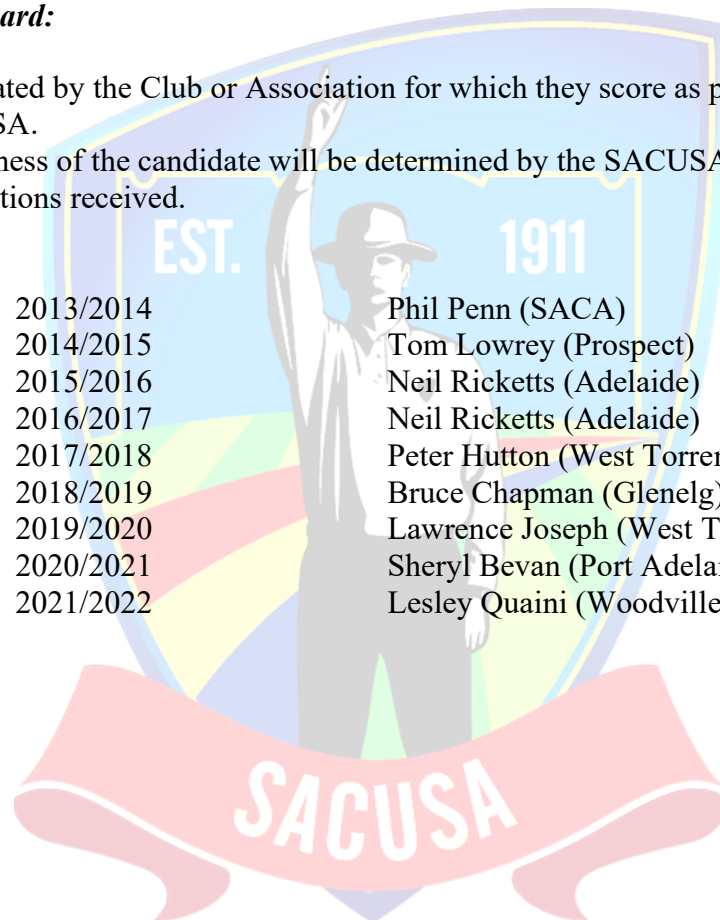

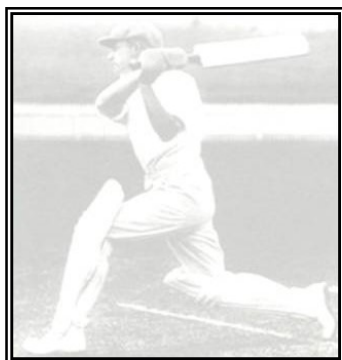

THE BRADMAN MEDAL



During season 1957/58 three SACUA Umpires, John McMenamin, Jack Kierse and Gordon Seymour, were enjoying a quiet drink after a SACUA meeting at the Hotel Adelaide in Pirie Street, when the 'idea' of an award for the best A Grade District Cricketer was proposed.

The original award, first made after season 1958/59, was based on one vote per game for the best player during an 'A' Grade match.

The first presentation dinner was held at the Seven Stars Hotel in Angas Street, Adelaide and was attended by approximately 30 umpires. Votes were counted during the dinner and, at the conclusion of the count, joint winners Ian McLachlan and Brian Quigley were announced. Neither of the winners were in attendance and taxis were sent to their homes to bring them to the dinner to receive their award.

During season 1976/77 it was decided that the District Cricketer Award should be renamed as the Bradman Medal and Sir Donald Bradman was approached for his approval. "The Don" agreed and said that he would be honoured to have the award named after him. The presentation of this prestigious award has continued, and the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner is now recognised as the pinnacle of any cricket season in South Australia.

Season 2007/08 celebrated 50 years since the inception of the District Cricketer Award/Bradman Medal. To celebrate this occasion winners (or family members) of the District Cricketer Award from 1958/59 to 1975/76 were presented with a Bradman Medal at the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner on 19th March 2008. Also, on the night three players who lost on a countback were awarded Bradman Medals.

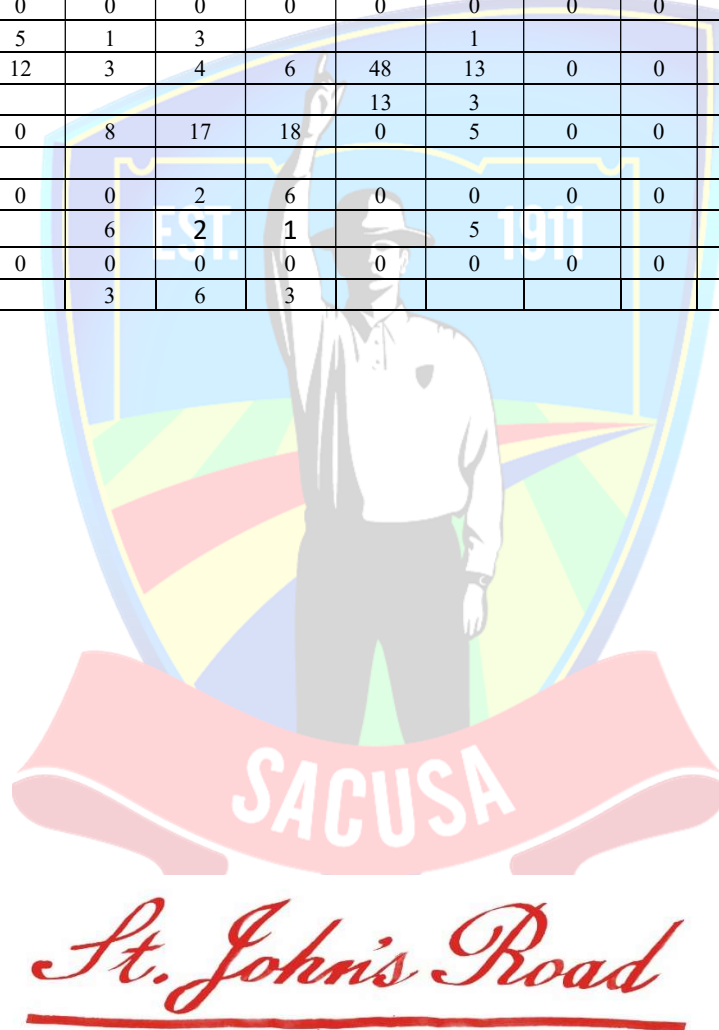
