1. Open Meeting

4. Minutes of 2018 AGM

The Minutes of the 2018 Annual Meeting as presented in the Annual Report were adopted on the motion of Tim Pellew and seconded by Michael Williamson.

5. Business arising from 2018 AGM

14. Declaration of Vacant Positions

The following positions are declared vacant as at 1st September 2019 – President, Vice President, Secretary and 3 Committee Members

15. Election of Office Bearers

President – one nomination – Ed Branson elected unopposed. Vice President – one nomination – Darran Swain elected unopposed. Secretary – one nomination – Michial Farrow elected unopposed.

16. Election of Committee Members

Committee – six nominations received – Ken Barthelson, Chris Hollard, Lesley Quaini, Bruce Stribley, Tony Trist and Michael Williamson. After a secret ballot – Chris Hollard, Bruce Stribley and Tony Trist were elected for two years. With Mike Lake resigning from the Executive this has created a vacancy on the committee and the secretary asked the three unsuccessful nominees if they would like to stand for this position and asked for any nominations from the floor. There were four nominees - Ken Barthelson, Adrian Drosd, Lesley Quaini, and Michael Williamson. After a secret ballot Lesley Quaini was elected for a year.

17. Life Member Nomination

We have one nomination for Life Member – Craig Thiele from Chris Hollard. Ed Branson spoke on behalf of the nomination and after a secret ballot Life Membership was bestowed upon Craig Thiele.

18. Subscriptions

The Committee has decided that our membership fees will remain at \$100.00 this season. Lynton moved that the fee structure as presented be adopted and seconded by Bob Woods and after a vote of the members the motion was passed.

19. Honoraria

Lynton Donisthorpe advised that the Committee proposed that the honorariums for next season remain at their current amounts. This was moved by Lynton Donisthorpe, seconded by Bob Woods and passed.

20. Auditors

Lynton Donisthorpe advised that the Committee proposed that the auditors for next season be the same as this year, Jeff King and Bob Woods. This was moved by Lynton Donisthorpe, seconded by Tim Pellew and passed.

21. General Business

- a. Ed Branson advised that the committee is looking at continuing the Historian Honoraria and asked if there were any objections and no objections were raised.
- b. Ed Branson advised that the committee several years ago decided to only use our logo in funeral notices for Life Members due to the additional costs for having the logo included and this current committee believes that this should stay as it is and asked if there were any objections. Adrian Drosd stated that he believes all members deserve the logo. As no other members commented Ed advised that his view will be noted.
- c. Tim Pellew advised that he is retiring from umpiring and Ed Branson on behalf of the committee and all members thanked Tim for his service.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

(Ed Branson)



SACUSA Members,

It is with great pleasure that I present the President's report of our Association's business for the 2018-2019 year.

While 2020 will undoubtedly be remembered as the COVID-19 year, our 2019/2020 season almost escaped with all minor round games being completed, but the virus struck, and all end-of-season finals were cancelled. Premierships were awarded to the sides that finished on top of the respective ladders at the end of the minor rounds, as you will recall, this did not meet with universal acclaim! However, our season started as normal, and your executive during the past season accomplished much.

In my report at the end of last season, I outlined the SACA Cricket Connects project and some of the initiatives that were gradually being rolled out across South Australia. During this past season enhanced communication between associations, between the various other stakeholders involving blind cricket, hearing impaired cricket, cricket for the intellectually impaired and indoor cricket have continued to develop. SACA has launched a review of grounds and facilities with a view to attracting Government funds to improve pitches, practice facilities and change rooms, particularly with the development and growth of women's cricket. Whilst the pandemic will undoubtedly impact the implementation of these initiatives, I expect that we will see improvements continue to unfold.

The premier Cricket Committee, as part of its response to the Cricket Connects project, established two new working groups:

- Vision and Strategic Plan Working Group
- Competition, Structures and Format Working Group

These were added to the Women's cricket working group from last season. Darran Swain represented SACUSA on the first, Lynton Donisthorpe on the second and Eloise Sheridan continued to represent us on the Women's cricket working group. All three have reported to Cricket Committee and the recommendations of the Vision and Strategic Plan working group have been adopted, most of the changes recommended by the Competition, Structures and Format working group have been rejected for implementation in the 2020/2021 season and the recommendations of the Women's cricket working group have also been accepted.

So, as outlined by Sarah Fry at the recent Cricket Officials season launch, in season 2020/2021, there will be 6 1st Grade women's teams with Glenelg taking the 6th position leaving 7 2nd grade teams. The Redbacks Leagues and the Under 12 Cup have been disbanded and the Under 17 Shield has been changed to an Under 18 Shield but there has been no change to the Under 16, Under 14 or 4th Grade competitions for 2020/2021. We are pleased that SACUSA can continue to contribute to the operation of Premier cricket on South Australia, and thank Darran, Lynton and Eloise for their work.

SACUSA also progressed its strategic review. Members will have noticed the members pack as an innovation this season and the changes to the meeting format. In the member survey, the shortening of the SACUSA meeting part of our monthly agenda plus the greater emphasis on umpire and scorer development as the main focus was generally appreciated. Members in the survey made several suggestions and the executive will seek to implement some of these. We are grateful to the many members who responded and gratified that members are aware of all the events SACUSA runs.

It was a strange conclusion to last season with no Bradman/Rolton medal night, no SACUSA Presentation Dinner (indeed, the awards will be presented tonight at the AGM in a significant departure from tradition) and no Easter President's XI v Vice President's XI cricket match. The biennial meeting between the SACUSA executive and the VCAUSA management committee at Penola over the June long weekend was

also cancelled but the meeting of the two associations was conducted as a Zoom event. These meetings have been of great value over the last 10 years or so, not only in facilitating fine-tuning of the Crocket Shield Easter visits, but also in sharing ideas to meet the various challenges that each association faces.

Your executive has conducted several of its meetings using Microsoft teams and Zoom platforms. We thank Shane Roberts for his assistance in organizing this.

We welcomed Lesley Quaini as a new member to the executive and Chris Hollard returned after some years of 'rest'. Both have made significant contributions; with Chris helping to drive our History subcommittee and Lesley playing a leading role in the joint SACUSA/SACA scorers subcommittee.

We were saddened by the departure of Tony Trist during the year when he moved to Ballarat in Victoria. Tony made an outstanding contribution to SACUSA, particularly in coordinating major updates of SACUSA policies, helping to steam-line our membership procedures together with work on IT. We wish Tony and Liz all the best in their new venture and hope that we will be able to catch up with them over Easter.

Each season a number of our members reach significant milestones, and these are detailed elsewhere in this annual report. However, I would like to acknowledge the wonderful contribution of Simon Fry who has continued the fine tradition of South Australian Officials performing with distinction at first class, international matches, including test levels. Simon has decided to retire, and we thank him for continuing to contribute to our association and for being a wonderful role model for aspiring umpires. Don Bills has reached 600 games this past season and this, too, is notable and worthy of special mention. Both men have a wealth of wonderful stories well worth members encouraging them to share.

In my report at the end of last season, I acknowledged the cooperative relationship that SAUSA has with SACA. Nathan Magill accepted a new role with Cricket Australia at the end of last season, so Daniel Goodwin took over his role. Craig Thomas and Mary Waldron were also added to the SACA umpiring department. Unfortunately, the COVID-19 pandemic has had a serious impact on SACA finances so these three people will not be continuing in their roles in the new season. We thank them sincerely for their efforts and wish them all well.

During the off-season three of SACA's Umpire coaches have decided to retire. John Biddis, Kim Perrin and Bob Woods have each made an outstanding contribution, Bob, in particular, over many, many years. We thank them on behalf of the entire cricket officials' community.

Last year in thanking my fellow executive members, I outlined the roles that each has played. They have continued in these roles with our new members undertaking the roles mentioned earlier in this report. Together the members of the SACUSA executive make a great team. Members can be assured that the association is well served, and I am sure that this will continue in the coming season. I thank them all for the support, sometimes-vigorous debate and friendship each has shown me. I really appreciate it and can recommend to any member who might consider joining this team that the experience is both worthwhile and fun.

In this, my final report as President, I wish to express my sincere appreciation for the wonderful support and encouragement that the executive generally, and I, personally have received from our members.

I have enjoyed the role of President immensely and it has been a special privilege to serve our cricket officials community. I wish all members all the very best for the new season and look forward to catching up with you.

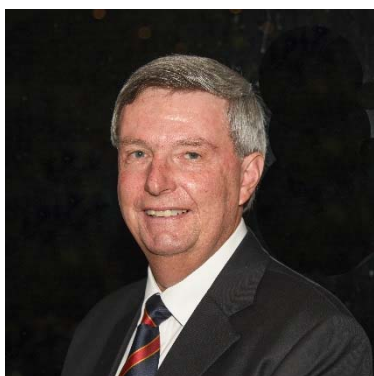

TREASURER'S REPORT (Lynton Donisthorpe)



Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

It is with great pleasure that I present to you the Treasurer's Report of our Association's business for the 2019-2020 financial year.

Balance Sheet Summary

This year has seen us deliver a significant surplus which was well above our forecasts. This was largely due to the cancellation or deferral of many events due to the COVID-19 virus. The result was under, or non, expenditure on a number of our significant events. However, these changes resulted in us transferring deposits, already paid, to the 20/21 Easter events. Receipts for the year of \$45,993.95 and payments of \$41,201.11, delivered an end of financial year balance in our working account of \$25,249.06 and a surplus of \$4,792.84 for the year.

Membership

Membership numbers remained constant in 2019/20 with 140 Full Members (142 in 2018/19) and 7 Associate Members (8 in 2018/19), Life Members are not included in these figures. The club scorer initiative, now in its 4th season, saw a significant increase with 8 clubs (3 in 2018/19) participating this year and bringing the number of full scorer members to 27.

Sponsorship

Sponsorship income was the same as 2018/19 with SACA continuing as a major sponsor and Coverdrive Couriers continuing the fantastic financial support they have provided to SACUSA for a very long time, on behalf of members, I thank them yet again for their significant contribution.

Budget Comparison

Our Surplus of \$4,792.84 was significantly above our budgeted/predicted Surplus of \$2,715.00. The most significant contributing factors were cancellation of the Bradman Medal event, the Family Fun Day/President vs Vice President match and deferral of the Presentation Dinner (totalling \$4459.34) not expended. While lower than expected clothing purchase and Umpire Handbook printing costs also contributed. We had above expected costs with consumable property (\$577.00 above budget) and Easter 2021 deposits (\$3,200.00), which we were able to "carry over" from the Presentation Dinner event and where consequently brought forward into the 2019/20 financial year. Remaining items were around budget estimates when allowing for the expected fluctuations. The EC adopt a conservative approach to budgeting, as we believe it is the prudent method of managing member's funds. This policy often results in financial outcomes considerably more advantageous, than those budgeted, which is evident again this year.

Trust Accounts

The Gladstone Jones and George McDonagh trust funds (held in Westpac Community Solutions Cash Reserve Account) realised interest as the only income. As a non-Easter year, we had no withdrawals from the account for Easter Trophies (the reason the money was bequeathed to SACUSA). Interest income for the year in the account was \$1.25, leaving a final account balance of \$1,202.24, split between the two funds as follows: Jones \$572.80 and McDonagh \$629.44.

Overview of Current Financial Position

SACUSA had a better than anticipated financial year again this year enhancing our strong financial position.

However, expectations are that the COVID-19 pandemic will result in significant income reductions in 2020/21 (and likely beyond). We therefore anticipate having to use some of our current surplus in order to maintain support to members, Association operations, goals and initiatives in the next and subsequent years. These recent events have highlighted how critical a strong financial position is to an organisation like SACUSA. The strong base we have built in recent years means we are well placed to weather the anticipated "financial storm" we expect in the next, and subsequent years. Without this basis, we would be in a very different position.

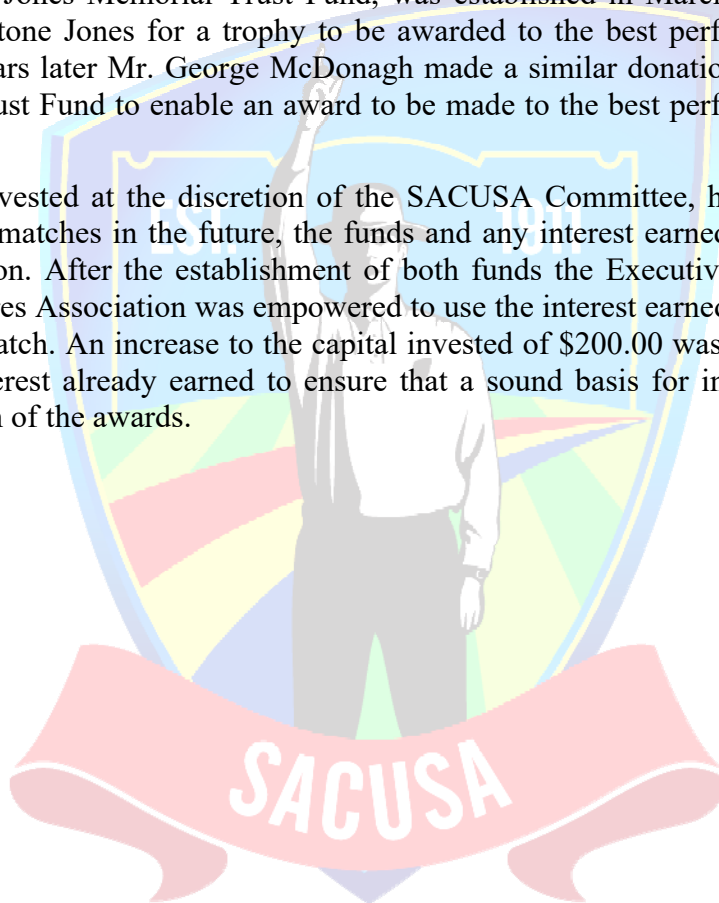

As a part of the biennial cricket match against the Victorian Cricket Association Umpires and Scorers Association, trophies are awarded to the best performed South Australian players for overall performance and fielding. These awards are made possible by trust funds held by the South Australian Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association from monies donated by former members, Gladstone Jones and George McDonagh.

The first fund, the Glad Jones Memorial Trust Fund, was established in March 1976 with a donation of \$150.00 from Mr. Gladstone Jones for a trophy to be awarded to the best performed player representing South Australia. Two years later Mr. George McDonagh made a similar donation, establishing the George McDonagh Memorial Trust Fund to enable an award to be made to the best performed fielder during these matches.

The donations remain invested at the discretion of the SACUSA Committee, however, if a decision was taken to discontinue the matches in the future, the funds and any interest earned was to be donated to the National Heart Foundation. After the establishment of both funds the Executive Committee of the South Australian Cricket Umpires Association was empowered to use the interest earned from both funds to award the trophies after each match. An increase to the capital invested of \$200.00 was made to each fund during the late 1980's from interest already earned to ensure that a sound basis for interest earning existed and therefore the continuation of the awards.

Mr. President and Members,

The Scorers Subcommittee for season 2019/20 met on a regular basis until the mid-March COVID-19 pandemic shut down made it difficult to meet in person.

Prior to the shutdown initiatives that were fulfilled include:

- The printing and distribution of Scorer Handbooks,
- Extending a closer working relationship with SACA match official staff,
- The continuation of SACUSA Membership Offers to SACA clubs,
- The issuing of SACUSA embroidered pencil cases and name badges to scorer members.

Unfortunately, the development and production of a Level 1 training course, updating recommended Payment Schedules for SACA Premier Cricket Scorers and Scorer Accreditation are still in the development stages, although have not yet progressed as far as we would have hoped.

Scorer membership has increased this season as a result of continued participation in the “Club Scorers Membership Offer”. SACUSA had 27 active scorer members from Adelaide, Glenelg, Kensington, Port Adelaide, Prospect, Tea Tree Gully, West Torrens and Woodville Premier Cricket Clubs in the 2019/20 season. Due to additional and direct personal contact, scorers were also encouraged to submit accurate match data so that personal milestones could be better acknowledged within this Annual Report. Thank you to the 13 members who responded and provided data. We hope this number will continue to grow.

Other successful initiatives that were introduced during the 2019/20 season were:

- The Match Officials Seminar, at the start of the season, was the first combined preseason forum with dedicated scorer training and development sessions,
- SACUSA Executive Committee initiated the incorporation of the SACUSA Subcommittee into a joint working group with SACA,
- Scorers were issued with a “Welcome” pack that included the Scorers Handbook as well as a calendar of SACUSA social events,
- SACUSA included specific scorer work groups into our monthly General meetings,
- SACA, via Sarah Fry, produced “Match Officials Monthly Updates” including ‘Getting to know you’ profiles featuring two of our most dedicated scorers in Mick Harper and Ian Graham. ‘Scorer Tips for Match Day’ have also been included in these editions.

Many of these initiatives have been achieved as a direct result of the joint scorer meeting format, with SACUSA working with SACA to achieve improved outcomes for scorers.

Many thanks to Sarah Fry, Neil Ricketts, Mick Harper, Lynton Donisthorpe and Ed Branson for their contribution to the Subcommittee throughout the year.

Congratulations must also go to Lawrence Joseph from the West Torrens Cricket Club, for being a most worthy recipient of the Buckett/Hammond Scorer of the Year Award 2019/20. He has been recognised for his invaluable dedication and contribution to both Men’s and Women’s cricket for over 10 years.

SACA STATE UMPIRING LEADER'S REPORT (Sarah Fry)



Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

Congratulations to all Match Officials who achieved their goals, reached milestones and had success during season 2019-20. While the end of the season was unfortunately cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic there are still many accomplishments to reflect upon.

The Match Officials preseason program started with winter sessions, the season launch and laws study nights. In total 166 umpires attended winter sessions; 381 umpires attended our laws study nights with an additional 400 umpires participating in over 30 individual sessions. The seminar was run across two days in September with 180 match officials in attendance and 14 presenters covering 17 sessions.

Many other training and development opportunities were offered throughout the season which included the Behind the Bails evening where ICC Match Officials, Richard Kettleborough, Richard Illingworth, Michael Gough and Shawn Craig joined us to share their experiences and stories ahead of the Adelaide Test Match.

Our Umpire Coaches also assisted with this development by continuing to assess umpires and provide feedback at matches throughout the season. The knowledge and experience that our coaches share with all umpires is very valuable and we thank them for their continued support.

There were over 5,500 umpire appointments in season 2019-20. Harsimran Singh travelled to New South Wales as part of our umpire exchange program and Jamaldeen Shakoordeen umpired in the Victorian Premier Cricket competition. Chris Grant and Kedar Oza came from interstate and were involved in our Premier Cricket competition.

More than 400 scorer appointments occurred with 30 scorers participating in development sessions. Our scorers had another eventful season with their involvement in many competitions including the Test Match, Sheffield Shield, BBL, WBBL, Second XI, National Premier T20 and Redbacks League.

Our State Panel of Eloise Sheridan, Mary Waldron, Harsimran Singh and Craig Thomas had a very busy season with appointments to the WNCL, Second XI, WBBL and BBL competitions. Mary and Eloise were both selected on the ICC Development Panel of umpires which provided extra opportunities with appointments to international matches.

HISTORY COMMITTEE REPORT

Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

It would be remiss of me not to acknowledge the historic challenges which communities across the world are experiencing at present, during what we now identify as the COVID-19 pandemic. The far-reaching consequences which are impacting on livelihoods, sport, routines, health and privileges which we have taken for granted until now, are changing our lifestyles and our economies, and are challenging our belief systems in what we thought we knew about the world. Our future history is being written today and is taking us in directions we may have never contemplated before. While that can be confronting and sometimes scary, it also presents opportunities to grow our resilience and compassion, and help us arrive at a place that might, in hindsight, be a more caring and inclusive environment.

In terms of collating the history of SACUSA, the 2019/20 Season began similarly to many others before it. However, change arrived in the form of former committee member and President, Chris Hollard, who re-joined the Executive Committee, and agreed to steer the creation of the SACUSA book as Project Manager. He called a meeting with me, President Ed Branson, and our own history-buff and driver of SACUSA's history work for many years, Max Bartlett (also a former President). Plans and structures were formulated; people had their allocated tasks – and then COVID-19 happened. However, that hasn't stopped the research and writing – but it has, understandably, slowed it down sometimes. One of the strongest lessons I'm learning from this pandemic, on a personal level, is that flexibility is key, and many options are on the table. While, without exception, everyone has challenges which they're dealing with, it's very important to remember that there's more than one way to achieve anything – and your History Sub-Committee is working in whatever ways it can to deliver the SACUSA membership a book that provides genuine insights into the work and character of the many people who have significantly contributed to South Australia's cricket officiating evolution throughout SACUSA's first one hundred years of existence.

Many of the people who we propose to feature in the SACUSA history book are Life Members of the Association. It's very rewarding to research a person's life – a person whose name appears each year in our Annual Report as a significant contributor from an era long past – and to rediscover their journey and achievements, knowing that they'll be remembered on the pages we're writing, and be formally recognised for their work into the future. One such person who will be acknowledged is John Rutherford McMenamin, SACUSA's 1968 Life Member. I was fortunate enough to meet John several years ago, after he moved into a nursing home. The visit was arranged by Max Bartlett, who had made contact with John's daughters as part of the history work we were doing. John donated some of his historic papers and records to SACUSA, and these are actively utilised during our research. While John was a driving force behind the creation of the 'District Cricketer of the Year Award' – which later became the 'Bradman Medal' – John was also constantly working across a range of social enterprises, both in paid and voluntary capacities. His life was full and giving, and SACUSA has been extremely fortunate to have been one of the recipients of his generosity of time and effort over the years. After 97 years on this planet, John passed away on July 27 this year, and was afforded a memorial service in the Ian McLachlan Room at Adelaide Oval. We pay our respects to John, and thank him and his late wife, Joyce (who our 'Joyce McMenamin Award' for informal support of SACUSA initiatives is named in honour of) so very much for the huge contribution they made to SACUSA's sustainability so that we can enjoy it today.

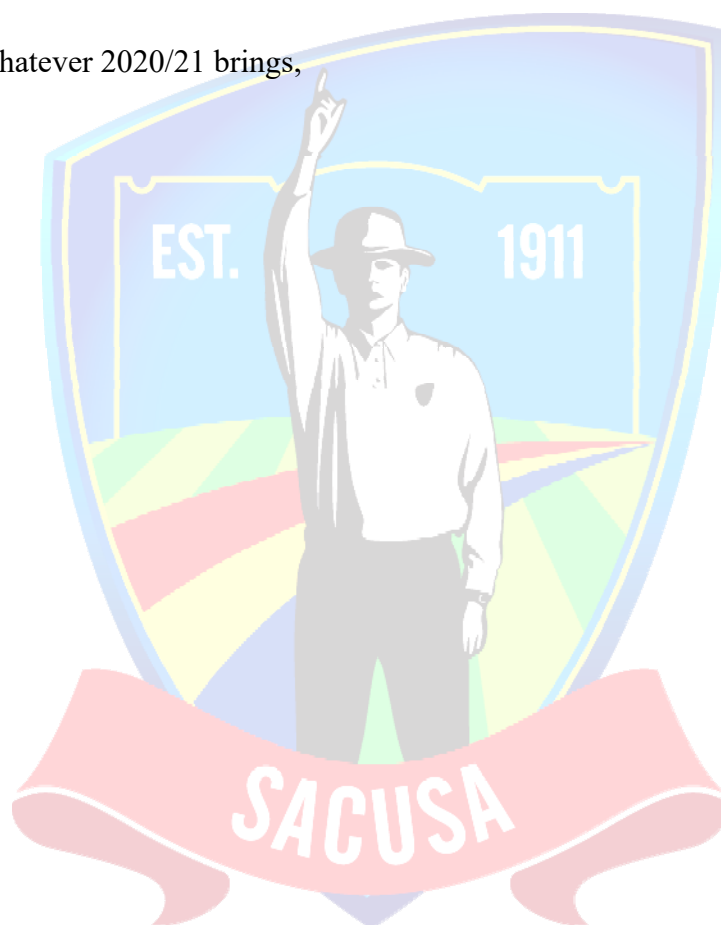
Lastly – and with much sadness – I'd like to acknowledge the passing of another strong contributor to cricket officiating in Australia, the late Alan McCarthy. Alan was the President of our Victorian counterpart Association, the Victorian Cricket Association Umpires and Scorers Association. He was a

dedicated facilitator and driver of our historic ‘Crockett Shield’ competition, and its accompanying contest, the ‘K C Butler Trophy’. His assistance in keeping the unique ‘Crockett Shield’ biennial fixture in our calendars so we can enjoy and grow the goodwill between Associations, which it fosters, is not to be underestimated – Alan’s commitment to the significant work required to arrange the event was unsurpassed, and SACUSA is eternally grateful to him for his gift of his time and effort for our enjoyment. We send our love to Alan’s wonderful wife, Sue, and to his family – and convey our thanks to the McCarthy Family for their contribution to our joint history.

While COVID-19 brought an abrupt and premature end to the 2019/20 Season, it also brought opportunities to adapt and to think differently. History is being made right now, and your contributions to it - via scoring, umpiring, and helping friends and family adapt to the changes - are crucial to the success of cricket in South Australia into the future. Thank you for being part of a history that can demonstrate resilience; for being part of a future that can provide an important outlet for communities through sport; and for being part of a present that is being challenged, but which can thrive with your help.

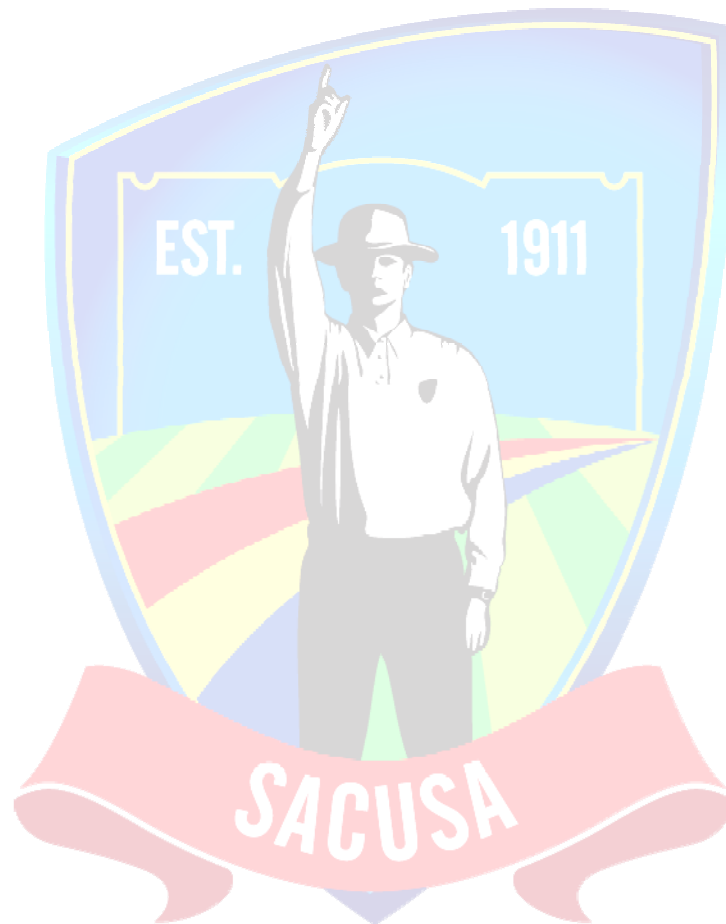

S.A.C.U.S.A. HALL OF FAME

Selection Criteria and Guidelines for Induction to the SACUSA Hall of Fame

- Rule 1. Candidacy is open to all umpires and scorers meeting the selection criteria who behaved in a manner which was conducive with the spirit and objectives of SACUSA.
- Rule 2. The SACUSA Executive Committee must appoint a Selection Panel of three impartial and independent individuals who decide on the successful inductees.
- Rule 3. The SACUSA Executive Committee is charged with the task of presenting a shortlist of possible inductees to the Selection Panel.
- Rule 4. Candidates must have made a very significant contribution to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia over an extended period of time. A candidate's worthiness is purely at the discretion of the Selection Sub-committee in order to be considered for nomination.
- Rule 5. Candidates must have demonstrated an exceptional dedication to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia and must not have illustrated behavior that would suggest a conflict with the ideals held by SACUSA during the era that the candidate actively contributed.
- Rule 6. Candidates must not have been actively umpiring or scoring within the cricketing environment for at least two years prior to nomination.
- Rule 7. The Hall of Fame must be reviewed at least every two years.

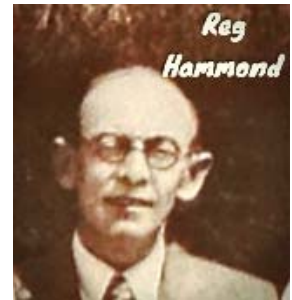

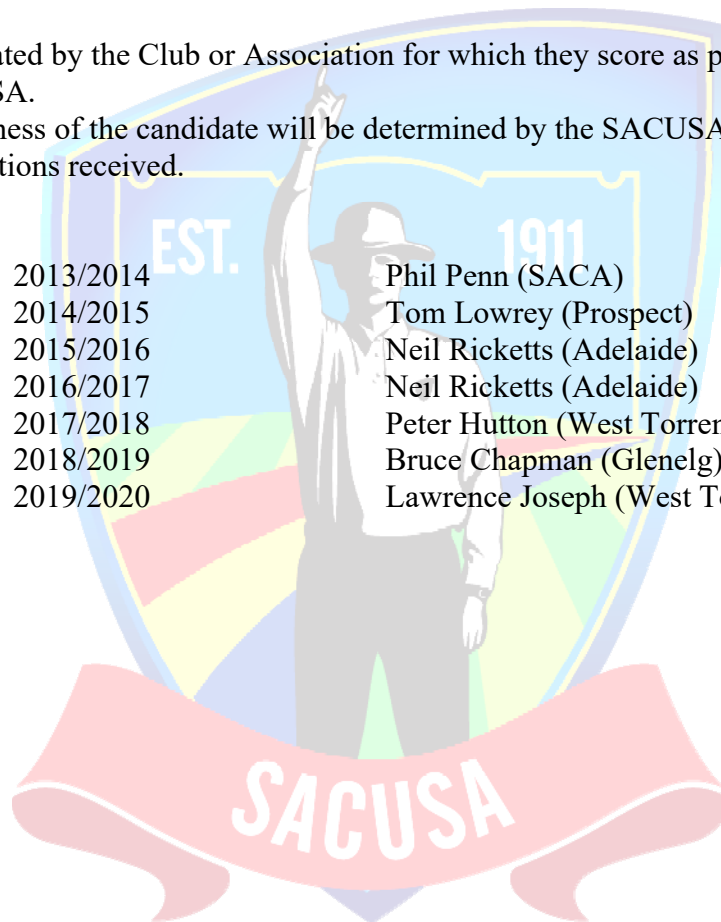

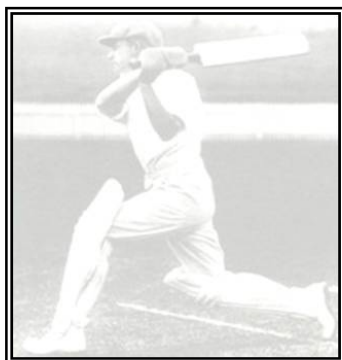

THE BRADMAN MEDAL



During season 1957/58 three SACUA Umpires, John McMenamin, Jack Kierse and Gordon Seymour, were enjoying a quiet drink after a SACUA meeting at the Hotel Adelaide in Pirie Street, when the 'idea' of an award for the best A Grade District Cricketer was proposed.

The original award, first made after season 1958/59, was based on one vote per game for the best player during an 'A' Grade match.

The first presentation dinner was held at the Seven Stars Hotel in Angas Street, Adelaide and was attended by approximately 30 umpires. Votes were counted during the dinner and, at the conclusion of the count, joint winners Ian McLachlan and Brian Quigley were announced. Neither of the winners were in attendance and taxis were sent to their homes to bring them to the dinner to receive their award.

During season 1976/77 it was decided that the District Cricketer Award should be renamed as the Bradman Medal and Sir Donald Bradman was approached for his approval. "The Don" agreed and said that he would be honoured to have the award named after him. The presentation of this prestigious award has continued, and the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner is now recognised as the pinnacle of any cricket season in South Australia.

Season 2007/08 celebrated 50 years since the inception of the District Cricketer Award/Bradman Medal. To celebrate this occasion winners (or family members) of the District Cricketer Award from 1958/59 to 1975/76 were presented with a Bradman Medal at the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner on 19th March 2008. Also, on the night three players who lost on a countback were awarded Bradman Medals.
