

The Bradman Rolton Medal night was again a sit-down formal dinner and was attended by 20 members. 

TREASURER'S REPORT (Lynton Donisthorpe OAM)



Mr President and SACUSA Members,

It is with great pleasure that I present to you the Treasurer's Report of our Association's business for the 2023-2024 financial year.

Balance Sheet Summary

This year we have delivered a significant surplus, see Budget Comparison section for details. Receipts for the year of \$60,491.16 and payments of \$50,397.56, provided a Working Account end of financial year surplus of \$10,093.60 and a balance of \$36,397.01.

Membership

Membership numbers increased by around 10% in 2023/24 with 133 Full Members (119 in 2022/23) and 6 Associate Members (3 in 2022/23), Life Members are not included in these figures. The club scorer initiative, now in its 8th season, saw 5 clubs participating this year and we had 17 scorer Full Members via this initiative and 2 scorers joined as individual members.

Sponsorship

Sponsorship income increased slightly from 2022/23 with SACA continuing as a major sponsor and Coverdrive Couriers continuing their fantastic financial support of SACUSA by increasing their sponsorship amount this season. On behalf of members, I thank them both for their significant contribution yet again this year, especially Coverdrive for their very long-standing support.

Budget Comparisons

Our Surplus of \$10,093.60 was significantly different to our budgeted/predictions. This was mainly due to a Government Grant of \$3,000, increased Membership income (\$2,350 above budget), A bequeath from Neil Dansie's estate of \$1,000 (not used at this stage), reduced social event and meeting costs as well as numerous other items coming in under budget. We should also acknowledge that the EC adopts a conservative budgeting policy which we believe is a prudent methodology for managing members funds.

Trust Accounts

The Gladstone Jones and George McDonagh trust funds (held in Westpac Community Solutions Cash Reserve Account), bequeathed to SACUSA for Crockett Shield Trophies, was expanded this year due to a generous donation by Peter Weddell of \$500 to SACUSA for the Easter Trophy in his name. We also had an additional donation of \$200 from Don Bills, also held in this fund. On behalf of members, I'd like to thank both Peter and Don most sincerely for their generous contributions. The donations and interest resulted in a total income for the year of \$700.12 in the account and a final account balance of \$1,960.50 split between the three funds as follows: Jones \$701.98, McDonagh \$758.48 and Weddell \$500.04.

Neil Dansie Bequeath

Neil bequeathed funds of \$1,000 to SACUSA to manage and use for recruiting umpires. These funds are held in our general account and identified on a separate line in the account. SACUSA will use these in the future for the purpose intended by Neil.

Credit Card Account

SACUSA opened a CC account in September 2022 to avoid the need for members to outlay personal funds for significant amounts and having to wait for reimbursement. This account has a \$0 overdraft limit and operates with a \$0 balance unless it is to be used. The CC was not used in the past financial year and has a \$0 balance.

Overview of Current Financial Position & Outlook

SACUSA had a much better than anticipated financial year. While currently showing a significant surplus, we will be required to expend some funds under the terms of the Government Grant in the coming financial year. However, we cannot lose sight of the fact that costs are increasing, making it more difficult to provide quality events and services to members. As a Not-for-Profit organisation, it is not our intention to "hoard" funds or deliver surplus every year, however, we do need to maintain a funds buffer, which we can only do by maintaining a balanced financial outcome income at the level of expenditure.

This year, the Association has maintained and strengthened the financial position we have built over the past decade which will ensure that SACUSA can thrive well into the future.

Glad Jones and George McDonagh Memorial Trust Funds



George McDonagh

As a part of the biennial cricket match against the Victorian Cricket Association Umpires and Scorers Association, trophies are awarded to the best performed South Australian players for overall performance and fielding. These awards are made possible by trust funds held by the South Australian Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association from monies donated by former members, Gladstone Jones and George McDonagh.

The first fund, the Glad Jones Memorial Trust Fund, was established in March 1976 with a donation of \$150.00 from Mr. Gladstone Jones for a trophy to be awarded to the best performed player representing South Australia. Two years later Mr. George McDonagh made a similar donation, establishing the George McDonagh Memorial Trust Fund to enable an award to be made to the best performed fielder during these matches.

The donations remain invested at the discretion of the SACUSA Committee, however, if a decision was taken to discontinue the matches in the future, the funds and any interest earned was to be donated to the National Heart Foundation. After the establishment of both funds the Executive Committee of the South Australian Cricket Umpires Association was empowered to use the interest earned from both funds to award the trophies after each match. An increase to the capital invested of \$200.00 was made to each fund during the late 1980's from interest already earned to ensure that a sound basis for interest earning existed and therefore the continuation of the awards.

SCORERS SUBCOMMITTEE REPORT (Lesley Quaini)



Mr. President and Members,

Over the last 12 months the Scorers Subcommittee has concentrated on: Scorer Training, Scorer Remuneration, Scorer Promotion, Domestic Scorer Appointments and Level 2 Representative Accreditation.

Scorer training sessions have become the 'norm' for the beginning of each season. Season 23/24 was no different, with the main emphasis being PlayHQ. One such session targeted questions/scenarios that were relevant to the attendees. Various PlayHQ Roadshows were also organized and well attended. Other training sessions included completing Cricket Australia

scorecards and NVPlay which is the scoring program used to operate Karen Rolton and Adelaide Ovals electronic scoreboards. E-scoring resources such as copies of a PlayHQ E-Scoring handbook are also available to all scorers/clubs/associations.

The skills required by a scorer are more complex than ever before. Therefore, scorer remuneration has become a focus with discussions occurring between interested groups. SACUSA has published Recommended Remuneration levels with the hope that Premier Cricket clubs are more consistent with scorer payments.

With the help of SACA's media department, scorer promotion is being advertised on the video screens in the Telstra Plaza at the southern end of Adelaide Oval. Business cards are also being finalised.

Once again, a 'pool' of 12 scorers were used across the summer to officiate at Men's and Women's Domestic and International level.

Level 1 Community Accreditation continues to be accessed via SACUSA's website by a cross section of clubs/associations within South Australia, both city and country. Also, scorers from Queensland, Northern Territory, Tasmania and Victoria have completed this level. Level 2 Representative Accreditation is nearing completion.

Congratulations to Mick Harper for being the inaugural recipient of the Neil Dansie OAM Memorial Award (Volunteer of the Year) and reaching the milestone of scoring 500 premier cricket matches. Congratulations to Neil Ricketts for scoring 700 premier cricket matches.

Thank you to Prospect, Port Adelaide, Kensington, Adelaide and Glenelg for joining the SACUSA Scorer Membership in 2023/24. Thank you to Sarah Fry, Mick Harper, Niel Ricketts and Lynton Donisthorpe for their time and commitment to the Subcommittee throughout the year.

SACA MATCH OFFICIALS' MANAGER REPORT (Sarah Fry)



Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

After another great season there are many achievements and milestones to celebrate. Well done to all Match Officials on your accomplishments, it was exciting to watch you develop and we look forward to what the future holds.

In August we welcomed the season in during a breakfast event at The Drive. Hosted by Ben Hook, Match Officials were given an insight into the season ahead and heard

from the experiences of Football Australia referee, Daniel Cook. Our annual Umpiring Seminar followed on the same day and umpires were treated to various development sessions on the key topics of decision making, player management and the importance of the umpiring basics.

Pre-season training then began with monthly training kicking in after matches had commenced. There were many subjects covered in these sessions and it was great to hear from several different guest speakers about their officiating careers and experiences in different sports.

For the first time we held The Umpiring Basics which was an introduction session covering the fundamentals of what an umpire requires and had a focus on general match day officiating. Throughout the season we offered regular Community Officiating accreditation workshops that resulted in welcoming new umpires into our ranks. For existing umpires, the Representative Officiating course was held to upskill those wishing to improve their umpiring.

Our umpire exchange program continued again with Nick Davies from Victoria appointed to umpire in our Premier Cricket competition. Richard Williams travelled to Melbourne in January for a new experience and was appointed to the two day match between Footscray and Melbourne University in their Men's Premier First. Purvag Nanavati also had the opportunity to travel when he was appointed to the Cricket Australia National Indigenous Championships held in Alice Springs.

Ian Lock, Cricket Australia National Umpire Coach visited Adelaide in November and provided our Umpire Coaches with practical training and a development opportunity. There was also the chance to share feedback and ideas around how we can further assist with the development of our umpires.

Prior to the Test Match, ICC Match Officials Adrian Holdstock, Nitin Menon, Shahid Saikat and Eloise Sheridan were our guests at Behind the Bails where we were enthralled by the insights and reflections of these umpires. Members from the Baseball Umpire Association of South Australia also attended this event and were provided with an officiating perspective from a different sport.

In April we launched our Female Umpires Network to connect our female umpires with each other and allow us to provide further support in their journey. Over time we hope to learn more about how we can encourage the recruitment of female umpires, the barriers and difficulties faced and where our support can improve.

Eloise Sheridan was again appointed to Cricket Australia's Supplementary Panel and Andrew Crozier, new to our umpiring ranks was also appointed to this panel for the first time. Eloise and Andrew both had fantastic seasons. Eloise's appointments included Women's Test Match, T20 and One Day Internationals, as well as Women's Tour matches, the WBBL Eliminator and her first Sheffield Shield match between Victoria and Queensland at the MCG in November.

Andrew was appointed as the third umpire in the WNCL Final, Tasmania versus Queensland at Blundstone Arena. His first-class debut was in the Sheffield Shield match, Queensland versus Tasmania at the Gabba in February and he umpired his first BBL match on field and made his List A debut in the Marsh One Day Cup.

Eloise and Andrew were also members of our State Umpire Panel along with Harsimran Singh and Dhaval Bhatt who were reappointed. They were joined by new members Kurt Miegel, James Cushway and Peter George. These umpires received many opportunities throughout the season which included:

S.A.C.U.S.A. HALL OF FAME

Selection Criteria and Guidelines for Induction to the SACUSA Hall of Fame

Rule 1.	Candidacy is open to all umpires and scorers meeting the selection criteria who behaved in a manner which was conducive with the spirit and objectives of SACUSA.							
Rule 2.	The SACUSA Executive Committee must appoint a Selection Panel of three impartial and independent individuals who decide on the successful inductees.							
Rule 3.	The SACUSA Executive Committee is charged with the task of presenting a shortlist of possible inductees to the Selection Panel.							
Rule 4.	Candidates must have made a very significant contribution to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia over an extended period of time. A candidate's worthiness is purely at the discretion of the Selection Sub-committee in order to be considered for nomination.							
Rule 5.	Candidates must have demonstrated an exceptional dedication to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia and must not have illustrated behavior that would suggest a conflict with the ideals held by SACUSA during the era that the candidate actively contributed.							
Rule 6.	Candidates must not have been actively umpiring or scoring within the cricketing environment for at least two years prior to nomination.							
Rule 7.	The Hall of Fame must be reviewed at least every two years.

The Joyce McMenamin Trophy

NEIL DANSIE OAM AWARD



Neil Dansie OAM was an Australian first-class cricketer and long-term administrator for South Australia. He is the seventh leading run-scorer for South Australia in Sheffield Shield. Nicknamed "Nodder" due to his habit of nodding in agreement when in conversation, Dansie was born in Nuriootpa, South Australia, the grandson of Sam Dansie, a leading country cricketer who represented a Broken Hill team against the touring Marylebone Cricket Club side. Dansie moved to Adelaide with his family as a child and excelled in a wide range of sports, including cricket, Australian rules football and baseball. He made his first grade cricket debut for Kensington Cricket Club aged 15, one of the youngest ever debutants in the South Australian Grade Cricket League.

In January 1949, Dansie was the last player to bat with Don Bradman in an official match, when Bradman played his final innings for Kensington against Port Adelaide Cricket Club at Alberton Oval. Dansie made his first-class cricket debut on 27 January 1950 on the WACA Ground against WA making 36 and 13. Dansie quickly gained a reputation as a hard-hitting batsman with a liking for the pull, sweep and cut shots and a steady off-spin and leg-spin bowler, as well as being known as one of the great characters of South Australian cricket, including gaining the title of being the world's fastest eater. He became only the second player to reach the milestone of 100 Sheffield Shield appearances and he achieved this feat in 1966. He had a prolific run for South Australia in first-class cricket scoring 6692 runs which accounted for more than 3/4th of his total first-class runs. His total tally of 6692 runs in 107 first-class matches puts him in the list of all-time top run scorers for South Australia in Sheffield Shield history. Despite being touted as one of the brightest prospects in Australian domestic setup, he never received a Baggy Green Cap. He was touted by many as a potential test match prospect throughout the 1950s. Neil Dansie OAM was SACUSA patron from 2008/2009 until his passing in 2023.

The Neil Dansie OAM Memorial award is presented and recognises an individual who has contributed and volunteer to the members of SACUSA behind the scenes with a positive attitude, a willingness to help in whatever capacity necessary, and a commitment to excellence.

Criteria:

- The candidate can be from any association.
- The worthiness of the candidate will be determined by the SACUSA Committee from those received.

THE BRADMAN MEDAL

During season 1957/58 three SACUA Umpires, John McMenamin, Jack Kierse and Gordon Seymour, were enjoying a quiet drink after a SACUA meeting at the Hotel Adelaide in Pirie Street, when the 'idea' of an award for the best A Grade District Cricketer was proposed. The original award, first made after season 1958/59, was based on one vote per game for the best player during an 'A' Grade match.

The first presentation dinner was held at the Seven Stars Hotel in Angas Street, Adelaide and was attended by approximately 30 umpires. Votes were counted during the dinner. At the conclusion of the count, joint winners Ian McLachlan and Brian Quigley were announced. Neither of the winners were in attendance and taxis were sent to their homes to bring them to the dinner to receive their award.

During season 1976/77 it was decided that the District Cricketer Award should be renamed as the Bradman Medal and Sir Donald Bradman was approached for his approval. "The Don" agreed and said that he would be honoured to have the award named after him. The presentation of this prestigious award has continued, and the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner is now recognised as the pinnacle of any cricket season in South Australia.

Season 2007/08 celebrated 50 years since the start of the District Cricketer Award/Bradman Medal. To celebrate this occasion winners (or family members) of the District Cricketer Award from 1958/59 to 1975/76 were presented with a Bradman Medal at the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner on 19th March 2008. Also, on the night three players who lost on a countback were awarded Bradman Medals.




THE SINCOCK MEDAL

During the 2023/2024 season, the first-grade men's competition was divided into two divisions. It became clear to SACUSA that Premier Cricket participants favoured separate medals for each division. While we believe there are valid reasons for both options, fundamentally SACUSA provide Premier Cricket medals to recognise player excellence and we therefore decided to respect their views and strike a new medal for 1st Grade, 2nd Division to recognise their achievements. SACUSA decided to name the new 2nd Division medal the Sincock Medal in recognition of Andrew Sincock OAM for his lifelong service to Cricket in SA.

Andrew is a former first-class cricketer who played for South Australia and was a fast bowler. Sincock was vice captain on the Australian school boys tour of the West Indies in 1969–70. He made his firstclass debut in 1974 and was the opening bowler for the 1981/82 South Australian Sheffield Shield winning team. That season he took his best figures 5-56. Andrew played as well as coached at both Representative and Premier/Grade level at numerous Premier/Grade Clubs and at virtually all levels, winning two Bradman Medals and one Wilson/McCloud Medal.

After retirement he was Head Coach of the West End Redbacks and AIS Cricket Academy. Sincock was elected to the South Australian Cricket Association (SACA) Board in 2000 and was vice president in 2013. He was awarded the Order of Australia Medal in 2017 for services to cricket.
