12. Scorers Report

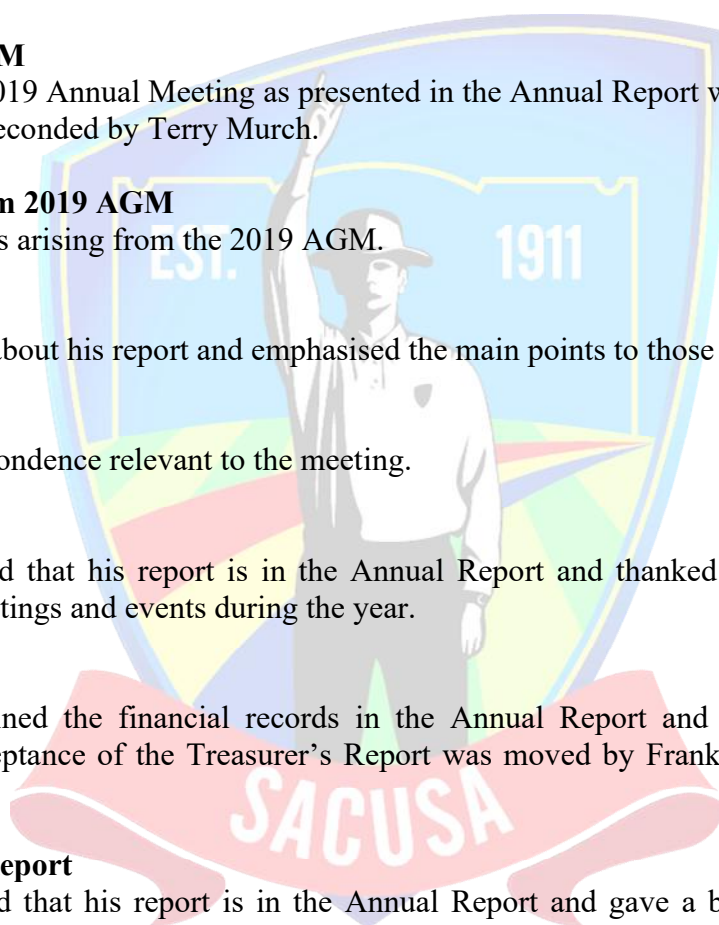
Lesley Quaini advised that her report is in the Annual Report and gave an overview.

14. Election of Office Bearers

President – one nomination – Darran Swain elected unopposed. Vice President – one nomination – Craig Thomas elected unopposed. Treasurer – one nomination – Lynton Donisthorpe elected unopposed.



15. Election of Committee Members

Committee – six nominations received – Fahmid Ahmed, Mark Fitzgerald, Lesley Quaini, Shane Roberts, Sumit Sindhu and Michael Williamson. After a secret ballot – Fahmid Ahmed, Lesley Quaini and Shane Roberts were elected for two years. With Tony Trist moving to Victoria and resigning from the Executive this has created a vacancy on the committee and the secretary asked the three unsuccessful nominees if they would like to stand for this position and asked for any nominations from the floor. PRESIDENT'S REPORT (Darran Swain)



SACUSA Members,

It is with great pleasure that I present the President's report of our Association for the 2020 – 2021 year – a year in which the South Australian Cricket Umpires & Scorers Association continued to support the growth of cricket in SA and across the nation.

With no finals being played at the end of the 2019-2020 season due COVID, it was fantastic to be able to have our 2020-2021 season back up and running. There was only one weekend in the season that cricket was cancelled due to a COVID 3-day lockdown in late November. This was a start of a 2-day game and SACA and the programming committee met through a zoom meeting to discuss possibilities. It was decided to revert the 2-day game into a one-day game the following week - therefore we didn't lose a round of cricket.

At the start of this season we saw umpire training and development take a new "direction" with no SACA umpire coach appointed due to the impact that COVID 19 had on SACA finances. We were fortunate enough to be able to have Sarah Fry, Amy White and Craig Thomas on board to assist us with training and appointments. A huge thank you to these people for all the hard work throughout the season, it goes without saying, it is very much appreciated. We must also acknowledge and thank the Umpires coaches who also took on extra work to assist with organising training for our panel meetings.

At last year's AGM, we welcomed Fahmid Ahmed and Sumit Sindhu to the executive committee for the first time and both have contributed on many levels.

In August, the 2020/2021 umpiring season launch was held at the Adelaide Zoo and in September our state-wide Umpire Seminar was held at West Beach. This annual pre-season training and preparation opportunity was generously co-ordinated by our State Umpiring Leader Sarah Fry, and was enhanced by invaluable support from our umpire coaches and Panel 1 umpires.

Our Association, over the past few years, has worked hard to include Scorers into our Association. I am pleased to announce that we have scorer memberships from 6 clubs (Adelaide, Port Adelaide, West Torrens, Glenelg, Kensington, & Woodville). I am sure we will increase these numbers with other clubs joining us as well over the next 12 months. Our Scorers Subcommittee, led by Lesley Quaini, have done a wonderful job in promoting scoring throughout SACUSA and SACA, and they are currently in the process of developing a scorer's accreditation and pathways program. Mick Harper has already started work on this and there will be different levels of accreditations and pathways as well as resources to assist with this process. Well done and thanks to Lesley Quaini, Mick Harper, Neil Ricketts & Sarah Fry for all their hard work in regard to training, development and promotion.

There have been many examples of noteworthy appointments during the season, especially those umpires who stood in their 1st T20 first grade game. I would like to offer my heartiest congratulations to Konrad Date who made his 1st grade debut on Nov 7th & 14th WT v Woodville. Congratulation also to Mary Waldron and Dhaval Bhatt who stood in their first 4-day 2nd XI match at KRO. Well done to both Mary and Dhaval who not only umpired a 4-day match but then umpired a 1st grade premier cricket match 24 hours later. On the national stage, it was fantastic to see Eloise Sheridan umpire not only the WBBL semi-final but also the final of the WBBL. Eloise had to deal with being in lockdown for several weeks in Sydney on her way to making the WBBL final. On behalf of SACUSA, congratulations Eloise on a magnificent tournament and it goes without saying we are all extremely proud of your achievements. Eloise has also just recently been appointed to CA supplementary umpire panel for 2021/2022 season, her hard work and commitment has certainly paid off. Congratulations Eloise on your appointment and we look forward to seeing you on the national stage.

Grand Finals are the goal for all teams each year, but they are also important for umpires. My congratulations go to all those who were selected to officiate in these very special matches. Your appointments reflect the truly great work you have done during the season.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the Bradman Rolton Medal night had a different format than in past years. This year there were number restrictions and was a stand-up cocktail function. It was still a brilliant night, where players from all clubs and umpires could mingle and catch up with each other. Congratulations to all the winners, in particular to our very own Mary Waldron for winning SACA Umpire of the Year.

Easter saw us, due to COVID, cancel the Crockett Shield match against the Victorians, however, this did not stop us from having our President v. Vice president match at Mylor. A fun day was had by all with 78 members and their families attending a fantastic day of socialising and being entertained by 2 games of T20. For the record the President side won game 1 by 8 runs and the Vice President side won game 2 also by 8 runs, so we declared it as a 'draw'. Thank you to all those that attended.

Our annual Presentation Dinner was hosted at a new venue this year, the Sage Hotel on South Terrace. The night was attended by 97 members and partners and the feedback was extremely positive, the food and service were outstanding. Congratulations to all the award winners and thank you to everyone for supporting our raffle and auction on the night.

Sponsorship is a vital part of sustaining SACUSA. We are very fortunate to receive support at our monthly meetings from those who supply raffle prizes as well as obtain prizes as for our Presentation Dinner from individuals to businesses. 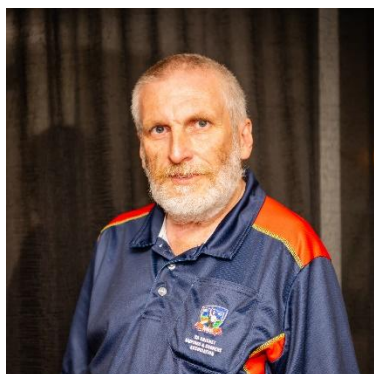

TREASURER'S REPORT

(Lynton Donisthorpe)



Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

It is with great pleasure that I present to you the Treasurer's Report of our Association's business for the 2020-2021 financial year.

Balance Sheet Summary

This year has seen us deliver a moderate surplus, due largely to refund of our Easter Deposits, paid in 2019/20 year, and cancelled events. This was well above our forecasts as detailed in Budget Comparison section of this report. Receipts for the year of \$38,734.84 and payments of \$36,428.58, delivered an

end of financial year balance in our working account of \$27,555.32 and a surplus of \$2,306.26 for the year.

Membership

Membership numbers were lower in 2020/21 with 127 Full Members (140 in 2019/20) and 4 Associate Members (7 in 2019/20), Life Members are not included in these figures. The club scorer initiative, now in its 5th season, was also lower, with 6 clubs participating this year (8 in 2019/20) and 24 full scorer members. However, we consider this a good result given the strain on club finances due to reduced SACA club funding this year due to COVID.

Sponsorship

Sponsorship income was the same as 2019/20 with SACA continuing as a major sponsor and Coverdrive Couriers continuing the fantastic financial support they have provided to SACUSA for a very long time. On behalf of members, I thank them both for their significant contribution again.

Budget Comparison

Our Surplus of \$2,306.26 was significantly above our budgeted/predicted Loss of \$3,695. This was mainly due to the availability of unbudgeted Sponsorship and Umpire Development Grants funding (not anticipated when budgeting), cancellation of Easter Event and the smaller Bradman Medal event cost, all due to COVID-19. Consumable property costs, largely badges, were higher than expected (\$1845.42 above budget) due to the higher number and increased prices. Remaining items were largely around budget estimates when allowing for expected fluctuations. The EC adopt a conservative approach to budgeting, as we believe it is the prudent method of managing member's funds. This policy often results in a more advantageous financial position, which is especially evident this year with such uncertainty due to COVID. The EC believe this is a responsible methodology of managing members funds.

Trust Accounts

The Gladstone Jones and George McDonagh trust funds (held in Westpac Community Solutions Cash Reserve Account) realised interest as the only income. As Easter did not proceed, we had no withdrawals from the account for Easter Trophies (the reason the money was bequeathed to SACUSA). Interest income for the year in the account was \$0.33, leaving a final account balance of \$1,202.57, split between the two funds as follows: Jones \$573.00 and McDonagh \$629.57.

Overview of Current Financial Position

SACUSA had a better than anticipated financial year this year. The anticipated financial impact of the COVID-19 pandemic was not as severe as it could have been. It had the potential to cause cancellation of the cricket season and loss of all membership income rather than the less significant effects of the modified social event programme that we did see.

We do anticipate having to use some of our current surplus funds for the coming year, with the cancelled 2021 Easter now planned for 2022.

The financial uncertainty we had this year, highlights again how critical a strong financial position is to an organisation like SACUSA, especially if the potential impacts of events like COVID, do come to fruition.

The strong base we have worked toward over the last decade means we are less vulnerable to these unforeseen “financial storms” we may be faced with. Without this base, SACUSA could find itself in a very different financial position.

Glad Jones and George McDonagh Memorial Trust Funds

As a part of the biennial cricket match against the Victorian Cricket Association Umpires and Scorers Association, trophies are awarded to the best performed South Australian players for overall performance and fielding. These awards are made possible by trust funds held by the South Australian Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association from monies donated by former members, Gladstone Jones and George McDonagh.

The first fund, the Glad Jones Memorial Trust Fund, was established in March 1976 with a donation of \$150.00 from Mr. Gladstone Jones for a trophy to be awarded to the best performed player representing South Australia. Two years later Mr. George McDonagh made a similar donation, establishing the George McDonagh Memorial Trust Fund to enable an award to be made to the best performed fielder during these matches.

The donations remain invested at the discretion of the SACUSA Committee, however, if a decision was taken to discontinue the matches in the future, the funds and any interest earned was to be donated to the National Heart Foundation. After the establishment of both funds the Executive Committee of the South Australian Cricket Umpires Association was empowered to use the interest earned from both funds to award the trophies after each match. An increase to the capital invested of \$200.00 was made to each fund during the late 1980's from interest already earned to ensure that a sound basis for interest earning existed and therefore the continuation of the awards.

**INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF THE

Scope:

I have audited the financial report, being a special purpose financial report of the South Australian Cricket and Scorer's Association Inc (SACUSA) for the year ended 30th June 2021 comprising the Statement of Receipts and Payments and Statement of Cash Balances.

Officer's Responsibility for The Financial Report:

EASTER REPORT

Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

After considerable deliberation by both ourselves and the VCAUSA, it was decided not to proceed with the regular Easter Event in Adelaide 2021 as scheduled.

This was due to the impact of Coronavirus on the health of Australians and the state border travel restrictions implemented to limit the virus spread.

These travel restrictions could be applied at any time with minimal notice (<1 day) and would prevent Victorian residents entering South Australia to attend the event, if in place at that time. This situation cast a significant shadow over the 2021 event, introducing uncertainty for members and their families and event planning for both Associations, not to mention potential significant financial losses for both Associations and members due to short notice cancellations.

For these reasons, both Associations agreed that it was untenable to hold the event in 2021 as scheduled and in December 2020 the very difficult decision was taken to cancel this event.

It should be noted that since its inception in 1931, this is only the 2nd time the Crockett Shield and Easter event has been cancelled (World War 2 being the first), both being a consequence of very significant world events.

Subsequent discussions with the VCAUSA have concluded in the decision to hold the next Easter event & Crocket Shield match in Adelaide next year in 2022, COVID allowing.

The Crockett shield Match and Easter weekend is truly a great tradition, and this is just one of the challenges the event has faced in its long and illustrious history, however it will endure, and I urge all SACUSA members to take part in the event when it returns, hopefully in Adelaide at Easter 2022.

Congratulations must also go to Steve Davis who was appointed as a member of Cricket Australia's Match Referee Panel and made his List-A Match Referee debut in the Marsh One Day Cup competition where South Australia played New South Wales at the Adelaide Oval.

Eloise Sheridan had a standout season and as a result of her appointment to the ICC Development Panel, 2019 brought an incredible experience when she was given her first opportunity to umpire international cricket. Eloise travelled to Scotland to officiate at the ICC Women's T20 World Cup qualifiers. HISTORY COMMITTEE REPORT

(Kristen Thomas)



Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

Firstly, I'd like to extend my congratulations to the SACUSA community for not only surviving a cricket season held during a global pandemic, but for adapting and serving the sport to provide very important health, exercise, and social connection opportunities for South Australians across 2020 and 2021. The positive impact you've made on sustaining cricket so people can continue their sporting careers – and their enjoyment – is immense and

valued.

Now that SACUSA is 110 years old, there's plenty of scope to take an historical perspective across time and observe how Association personnel have dealt with global challenges in eras past – just as a matter of interest, and for comparison. One hundred or so years ago, during 1918/19, when the world was emerging from the completion of the First World War, the umpires officiating in SACA matches were Phil Argall Jnr, Norman Barlow, Jack Bruce, William Bache, Charles Bradshaw, George Colyer, Claude Cornish, George Carr, John Davies, Alfred Drummond, John Dodds, John Harley, Alby Kruss, Archie McIntyre, and Fred Thomas. Nine of these fifteen who sustained the young organisation during the heavily war-impacted years were later awarded Association Life Membership, and we can thank them for setting a benchmark which guides our current membership to keep working for cricket officials. Without that culture, there would be no opportunity for those performing the all-important scoring and umpiring roles to feed into conversations about meeting the needs of those roles. Now well advanced into its second century, the telling of SACUSA's history will not only contain richness but will also be opportune in terms of telling its story just as it likely takes a new direction in a changing environment. Multiple game formats, equal competitions for females and males, recruitment of female officials, adaptable competition fixtures that accommodate pandemic-related interruptions – it's comforting to see that everything in cricket officiating has changed since our Association began in 1911, because it means that the environment is evolving, and improving. And that is what the SACUSA history book is aiming to reveal.

Since Executive Committee, Chris Hollard, took the reins of the history sub-committee last season, some solid progress has been made. A significant number of thoroughly researched profiles of Life Members from the early 20th century have been completed, providing an interesting insight into society of the time, and acknowledgement of the social issues that existed. Life Member, Max Bartlett, is continuing his work on compiling and writing profiles of Association contributors from the latter part of the 1900s, which is also progressing well. A comprehensive framework has been created, and the plan is to continue the pace so the writing can be completed as soon as possible. While it is contingent on the capacity of volunteers to write the history, the goal is also to tell the stories of volunteers – and so the cycle of dedication to volunteering for community continues.

A lovely initiative was driven by the SACUSA Executive in 2020/21 – the creation of a special 'SACUSA Coin', presented to members for them to use when it's time for the coin toss at the commencement of each match. The inspiration for SACUSA's establishment, Phil Argall, was chosen by the committee as the person to be featured as the 'head' – with the 'tails' side showing the current SACUSA logo, complete with the year of issue and the Association birth date of 1911. (The coins will be distributed to members on payment of their subs for 2021/2022 – Editor's note)

Our collection of SACUSA memorabilia continues to grow, as donations are made periodically by people who learn of our Association's quest to capture our history. Their assistance in collecting these items is invaluable. During the 2021/22 season, we might be provided an opportunity to display some

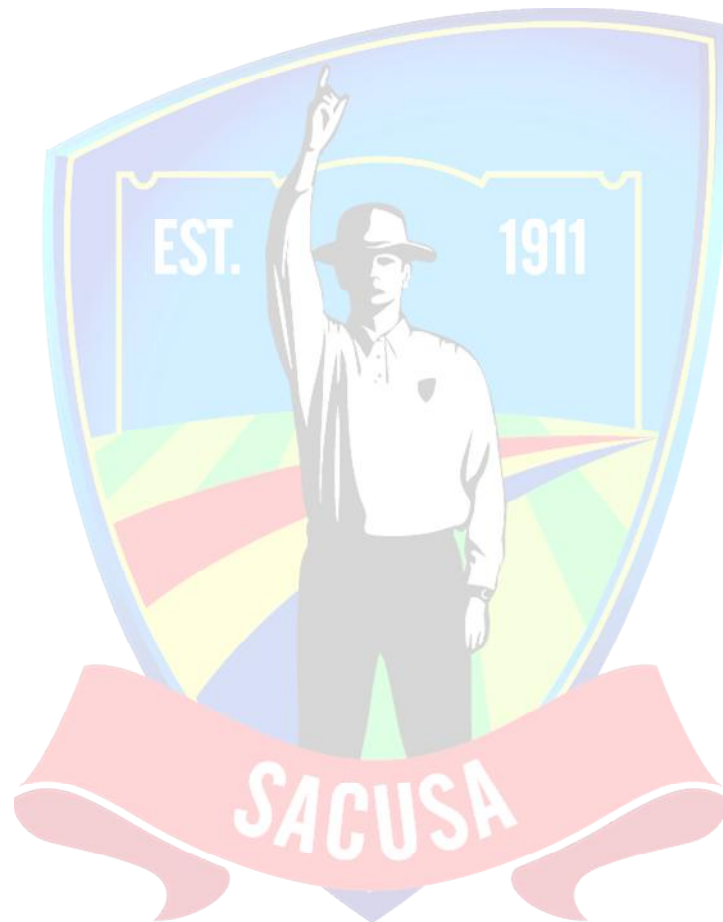
of our collection at Karen Rolton Oval pavilion, so members will be able to see it when attending. Fingers crossed this happens – we'll keep you posted throughout the season if it eventuates this year.

Many thanks to all members who continue to provide encouragement and support in seeing our history written and collected. We constantly find out more about SACUSA – rediscovering details about contributors and happenings from times past that have drifted out of living memory. It really is a privilege to bring this information to members.

Best wishes to you all for a wonderful 2021/22 cricket experience. I hope you aren't impacted by more COVID-19 disruptions – but if you are, rest assured that your Association will continue to support your roles and industry as it has for 110 years so far.

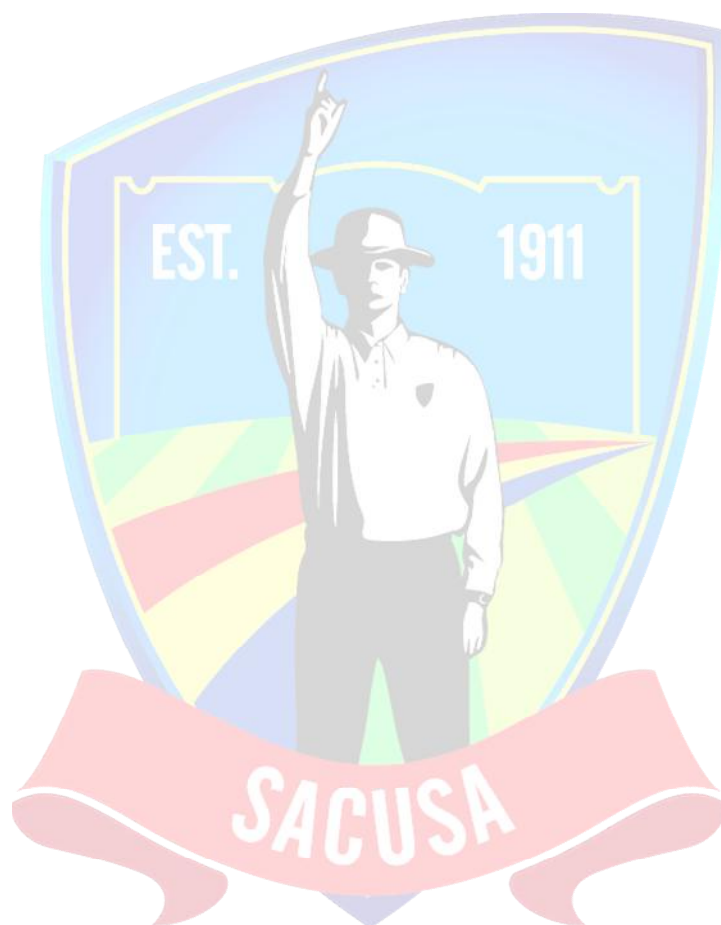



S.A.C.U.S.A. HALL OF FAME

Selection Criteria and Guidelines for Induction to the SACUSA Hall of Fame

- Rule 1. Candidacy is open to all umpires and scorers meeting the selection criteria who behaved in a manner which was conducive with the spirit and objectives of SACUSA.
- Rule 2. The SACUSA Executive Committee must appoint a Selection Panel of three impartial and independent individuals who decide on the successful inductees.
- Rule 3. The SACUSA Executive Committee is charged with the task of presenting a shortlist of possible inductees to the Selection Panel.
- Rule 4. Candidates must have made a very significant contribution to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia over an extended period of time. A candidate's worthiness is purely at the discretion of the Selection Sub-committee in order to be considered for nomination.
- Rule 5. Candidates must have demonstrated an exceptional dedication to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia and must not have illustrated behavior that would suggest a conflict with the ideals held by SACUSA during the era that the candidate actively contributed.
- Rule 6. Candidates must not have been actively umpiring or scoring within the cricketing environment for at least two years prior to nomination.
- Rule 7. The Hall of Fame must be reviewed at least every two years.

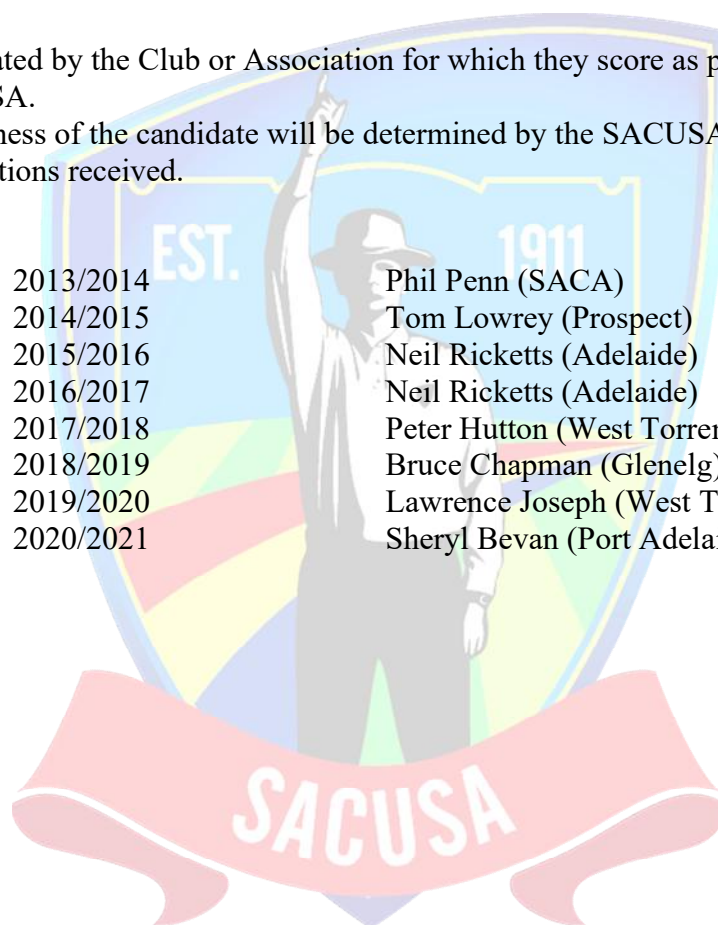

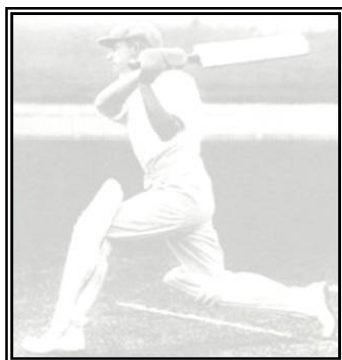

THE BRADMAN MEDAL



During season 1957/58 three SACUA Umpires, John McMenamin, Jack Kierse and Gordon Seymour, were enjoying a quiet drink after a SACUA meeting at the Hotel Adelaide in Pirie Street, when the 'idea' of an award for the best A Grade District Cricketer was proposed.

The original award, first made after season 1958/59, was based on one vote per game for the best player during an 'A' Grade match.

The first presentation dinner was held at the Seven Stars Hotel in Angas Street, Adelaide and was attended by approximately 30 umpires. Votes were counted during the dinner and, at the conclusion of the count, joint winners Ian McLachlan and Brian Quigley were announced. Neither of the winners were in attendance and taxis were sent to their homes to bring them to the dinner to receive their award.

During season 1976/77 it was decided that the District Cricketer Award should be renamed as the Bradman Medal and Sir Donald Bradman was approached for his approval. "The Don" agreed and said that he would be honoured to have the award named after him. The presentation of this prestigious award has continued, and the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner is now recognised as the pinnacle of any cricket season in South Australia.

Season 2007/08 celebrated 50 years since the inception of the District Cricketer Award/Bradman Medal. To celebrate this occasion winners (or family members) of the District Cricketer Award from 1958/59 to 1975/76 were presented with a Bradman Medal at the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner on 19th March 2008. Also, on the night three players who lost on a countback were awarded Bradman Medals.
