





Reaching the Grand Final is a significant achievement for all teams each year and holds equal importance for umpires. SACUSA hosted several social events this year, including the Bradman Rolton Medal Night and the annual Presentation Dinner. Members also took part in the Crockett Shield match in Ballarat, fostering camaraderie and competition. The Bradman Rolton Medal Night brought together 20 members, offering networking opportunities for players and umpires. Congratulations to all award winners, especially Mary Waldron, who was named SACA Umpire of the Year.

During Easter, 37 members and partners travelled to Ballarat for the Crockett Shield match against VCAUSA. SACUSA won by 78 runs, while VCAUSA reclaimed the K C Butler Trophy on Sunday with a one-point victory. Thanks go to everyone involved in organising and attending.

The Presentation Dinner drew 74 attendees, with Shane Bernhardt as Master of Ceremonies. Acknowledgements to Shane Roberts, Bruce Stribley, Angela Swain, and James & Mikaela Cushway for their organisational support. Details of award winners are available in the annual report. This season our event attendance rose by 10% from previous years, showing greater member engagement. Please keep an eye on our website and social media pages for catchups and events.

In discussions with SACA in June last year, the criteria for umpire awards underwent revision, with the new criteria announced during meetings held in September and October. It was determined that no points would be awarded for post-match catchups, and that 0.5 points would be allocated to all major activities, including the presentation dinner.

Enhanced communication through newsletters and social media kept members informed of milestones and events. The association acknowledged the vital support from sponsors and thanked committee members and families for their dedication and assistance throughout the season. Thanks to Fahmid Ahmed & to James Cushway for keeping us updated.





TREASURERS REPORT (Lynton Donisthorpe OAM)



Mr President and SACUSA Members,

It is with great pleasure that I present to you the Treasurer's Report of our Association's business for the 2024-2025 financial year.

Balance Sheet Summary

This year we have delivered an expected small deficit, see Budget Comparison section for details. Receipts for the year of \$46,562.51 and payments of \$48,073.04, provided a Working Account end of financial year deficit of \$1,510.53 and a balance of \$34,886.48.

Membership

Membership numbers increased slightly again in 2024/25 with 137 Full Members (133 in 2023/24) and 8 Associate Members (6 in 2023/24), Life Members are not included in these figures. The club scorer initiative, now in its 9th season, saw 4 clubs participating this year, as well as 3 scorers from 2 clubs who joined independently outside of the Club programme. We had a total of 17 scorer Full Members this season.

Sponsorship

Sponsorship income increased significantly from 2023/24 with SACA and Coverdrive Couriers continuing their fantastic financial support. Coverdrive increased their sponsorship amount again this season, for the 2nd year in a row. We were delighted to be joined by 3 new sponsors this season, King William Road Chiropractic, Specialist Eye Surgeons SA and Quicken Loans. On behalf of members, I thank all sponsors for their significant contribution.

Budget Comparisons

Our deficit of \$1,510.53 was commensurate to our budget predicted loss of \$2,110. We saw our membership income grow again this year (\$3,205 above budget), sponsorship increase (\$1,436.10 above budget) and reduced social event costs which were again below budget (\$943.97 below budget). On the other side, we saw the Presentation Dinner cost exceed budget (\$1,342.34 above budget), due largely to the lower than anticipated attendance. Bradman/Rolton medals cost was up due to additional medals for tied medal winners (\$685.00 above budget) and property costs remaining high (note, we currently carry good stock levels). We should acknowledge that the EC prefer to use conservative budgeting as a prudent methodology for managing members funds.

Trust Accounts

The Gladstone Jones, George McDonagh and Peter Weddell trust funds (held in Westpac Community Solutions Cash Reserve Account) was money bequeathed, or donated to SACUSA for Crockett Shield Trophies. Westpac have recently increased the interest rate on this account which will assist us to maintain the account funds. 2025 being an Easter year, total trophy costs of \$254.85 were withdrawn from the account this year (\$84.95 from each account). With the total income for the year of \$6.42, the final account balance of \$1,712.07 was split between the three funds as follows: Jones \$619.17, McDonagh \$675.67 and Weddell \$417.22.

Neil Dansie Bequeath

The \$1,000 bequeathed by Neil Dansie to SACUSA to assist recruiting umpires, was again not spent this year. These funds are held in our general account and identified on a separate line in the account. SACUSA will use these in the future for the purpose intended by Neil.

Credit Card Account

The SACUSA CC account that we opened in September 2022 was closed this year by Westpac due to inactivity, virtually without our knowledge. The EC have decided not to open a new account at this stage and intend to minimize the use of members personal funds for significant purchases using other strategies.

Overview of Current Financial Position & Outlook

SACUSA had a relatively balanced year financially. However we cannot lose sight of the fact that costs are increasing, making it more difficult to provide quality events and services to members. As a Not-for-Profit organisation, it is not our intention to carry significant funds. However, we do need to maintain a funds buffer, which we can only do by maintaining an annual balance sheet which is relatively balanced, which is our objective.

This year, the Association has maintained the strong financial position we have built over the past decade which will ensure that SACUSA can continue to thrive well into the future.

Glad Jones and George McDonagh Memorial Trust Funds

As a part of the biennial cricket match against the Victorian Cricket Association Umpires and Scorers Association, trophies are awarded to the best performed South Australian players for overall performance and fielding. These awards are made possible by trust funds held by the South Australian Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association from monies donated by former members, Gladstone Jones and George McDonagh.

The first fund, the Glad Jones Memorial Trust Fund, was established in March 1976 with a donation of \$150.00 from Mr. Gladstone Jones for a trophy to be awarded to the best performed player representing South Australia. Two years later Mr. George McDonagh made a similar donation, establishing the George McDonagh Memorial Trust Fund to enable an award to be made to the best performed fielder during these matches.

The donations remain invested at the discretion of the SACUSA Committee, however, if a decision was taken to discontinue the matches in the future, the funds and any interest earned was to be donated to the National Heart Foundation. After the establishment of both funds the Executive Committee of the South Australian Cricket Umpires Association was empowered to use the interest earned from both funds to award the trophies after each match. An increase to the capital invested of \$200.00 was made to each fund during the late 1980's from interest already earned to ensure that a sound basis for interest earning existed and therefore the continuation of the awards.



SCORERS SUBCOMMITTEE REPORT

(Lesley Quaini)



Mr. President and Members,

Raising the profile of scorers and acknowledging them as part of the 'third team' in a game of cricket is very important. Consequently, our focus continues to be Scorer Training, Scorer Accreditation, Scorer Remuneration and Scorer Promotion.

Scorer Training is a continuing practice. PlayHQ is not perfect, but the program is getting better thanks to CA listening to points raised by scorers. There are still concerns about the DLS program, but scorers are now able to download the DLS link on the SACA Premier Cricket website. For scorers wanting to succeed at the next level emphasis on CA scorecards completion and using running sheets is recommended. It is pleasing to see that the Level 1 Community Accreditation continues to be completed via SACUSA's website not only in South Australia but interstate and overseas. The Level 2 Representative Scorer Accreditation is still ongoing. During season 24/25 a selected group of SACA scorers who have already or have ambitions to score at a higher level, were approached to trial the proposed process. It was determined that a SACA Match Officials representative would chair the process of measuring proficiency in e-scoring, scorecard legibility and accuracy, use of a running sheet, operation of electronic scoreboards, communication and teamwork skills. The outcome/feedback would then be communicated back to all applicants who wish to submit their documentation for assessment, to gain this level of accreditation.

Scorer Remuneration is also ongoing. Proposals have been documented but the difficulty is finding the funds to carry out those proposals. Scorer Promotion Business Cards and Posters have been printed and distributed to Premier Cricket Clubs. Scorer advertising was shown on the big screen at Adelaide Oval during domestic games this season as well as images displayed at the southern end entrance to the oval. This has generated more awareness of scoring.

A review of SACUSA's Scoring Handbook, first published in 2018, was also begun to update e-scoring information as well as correcting any invalid facts. Once the adjustments have been completed the handbook will first be published electronically so there is an opportunity to seek feedback before printing hard copies.

Several scorers were used by SACA to officiate at the CA U19 competition in Adelaide in December 2024. For this competition, depending on availability, each team had a designated scorer. This proved to be quite successful for all individuals involved because it allowed them to feel more attached to the team they were scoring for. The NT side took the next step by providing their scorer with a competition matchday top as well as each team member personally thanking their scorer at the end of their last game, which I personally saw.

Congratulations to the following scorers who achieved personal milestones during the 24/25 season. Mike Blackwell 100 1st Grade games, Hitesh Bajoria 200 games and Anthony Rogers 400 games, all scorers are encouraged to submit their stats to SACUSA so that their milestones are given the recognition they deserve. Thank you to Kensington, Adelaide, Glenelg and Port Adelaide for joining the SACUSA Scorer Membership in 2024/25. Thank you to Sarah Fry, Emily Brown, Tom Fenoughty, Mick Harper, Neil Ricketts and Lynton Donisthorpe for their time and commitment to the Subcommittee throughout the year. Congratulations Hitesh Bajoria from the Prospect District Cricket Club for being named SACUSA Bucket/Hammond Scorer of the Year 24/25. Since his scoring journey started in 2018 at 4th Grade level, he has scored at higher levels including Sheffield Shield and Big Bash League, always with a high degree of professionalism.

EASTER REPORT (Lynton Donisthorpe OAM)



Mr President and SACUSA Members,

The Crockett Shield Easter event 2025 was held in Ballarat Victoria. The team was managed by captain Kurt Miegel and vice-captain James Cushway, with Darran Swain and Bruce Stribley lending support. A special mention to Team Manager Shane Roberts, umpire Terry Murch and scorer Neil Ricketts for their great assistance managing the event.

I'd like to acknowledge the huge effort that was put in by the VCAUSA organizing team (as per every Easter for the hosting state) lead by coordinator Gerry Schembri.

This year accommodation was at the Mercure in Ballarat which was also the venue for the Friday and Saturday dinners as well as the Monday Breakfast, with these events being held in the "Eureka Ballroom". The match was played at East Ballarat Cricket club where pitch, ground and clubroom facilities were excellent. It must be said that we struggle to provide the level of facilities that the VCAUSA can provide given the number of very good grounds that seem to be available in Victoria, especially given Easter this year was so late in April.

We again produced a joint Law43/Sticky Wicket publication, new "baggy red" numbered caps for debutant players, and our "loan" playing shirts worked well to make our players look resplendent. We again offered supporter shirts to attendees, all of which contributed to the weekend's experiences.

The traditional Friday dinner lived up to expectations with quips from the VCAUSA about "failure to prepare a pitch" in 2023 and Kurt responding accordingly, not much new here! Teams were introduced and SACUSA numbered caps presented to CS debutant players, Robert Ferretti, Mohak Nijhawan, Purvag Nanavati & Kieran Ryan. It should be mentioned that Crockett Shield history was made with former Australian international player, Louise Broadfoot playing for the VCAUSA, the first female player to play in the Crockett Shield.

Game day saw a largely overcast day but mild and fine weather throughout with a good pitch presented at East Ballarat CC (no delay to play this time around!). It proved to be a good toss to lose with VCAUSA 'umming' and 'ahhing' when the coin fell their way before deciding to bowl first. Following the traditional remembrance ceremony in respect to members who have passed since Easter 2023, the stage was set.

Despite an early wicket, runs flowed freely against the spin heavy Victorian bowling. Already 2/92 at 20 overs with set batters, the challenge was thrown down to pass 200 for SACUSA's first time in CS history. Craig Thomas dominated the bowling to finish 80 from just 68 balls, an effort that would see him awarded both the Gladstone Jones Batting Trophy along with the coveted McGregor Medal as player of the match. He was ably assisted by Anup Kodikoppal (45) and vice-captain James Cushway (25), Thomas making a new 4th wicket partnership record with the later of 83 in just 12 overs. A flurry of late run outs did little to dampen the joy of finishing 9/219, SACUSA's highest ever score and second highest score of all time in the match.

Tanmoy Sana, who would go back-to-back for the George McDonough Fielding Trophy, performed a superb direct hit run out for the first Victorian wicket. The VCAUSA were in the game though as, following a quiet start, they started to make a fist of the chase and could claim to be marginally ahead at 20 overs on 3/101. However, from a knives edge the game swung SA's way as debutant Robert Ferretti claimed 4 for 21 after drinks, 3 of his wickets coming amongst a collapse of 6 for 12 by VCAUSA to

see them all out for 141 and see the Crockett Shield retained by a margin of 78 runs. Ferretti would receive the Peter Weddell Bowling Trophy for his efforts, and not satisfied with 2 awards already, Craig Thomas would also take home the Skull award in addition to the McGregor medal. Umpires Terry Murch and Steve Pitts received the Peter Cronin medals while scorers Neil Ricketts and Ben Lu received the Howard medals.

On Sunday, the family fun event for the KC Butler trophy was contested over a combination of game events at the East Ballarat CC. Unfortunately, we lowered our colours to the VCAUSA by just 1 point (25 to 26), only the 3rd time the VCAUSA have held this trophy since its inception in 2001. Monday morning saw us all enjoy breakfast as the last chance to socialize and say goodbye until our next Crockett Shield event in 2027.


The unity between our two Associations and their members over the weekend was very evident throughout and I feel is getting stronger, with Easter relationships extending beyond just Easter throughout the year.

SACA MATCH OFFICIALS' MANAGER REPORT (Emily Brown)

Mr President and Members of SACUSA,



Umpires and scorers are passionate volunteers who make a critical contribution to cricket in South Australia. Our cohort of match officials continues to grow, and we are committed to attracting, developing and supporting more umpires and scorers to service the game into the future.

We welcomed the 2024/25 season with our Match Officials Season Launch breakfast, hosted by Wayne 'Flipper' Phillips at Adelaide Oval in mid-August. Flipper interviewed former South Australia and Netherlands player Tom Cooper, who highlighted the importance of positive and open communication from umpires and discussed the indispensable role scorers play in the world of cricket.

Following breakfast, we held our Umpiring Seminar which forms a key part of our development strategy each season. Over 100 umpires heard from guest facilitators on topics including resilience and performing under pressure, expectations of an umpire, laws and decision making, and emotional and cultural intelligence in umpiring.

Monthly Umpire Training sessions provided a regular touchpoint for active umpires to access support and education. We also maintained a network of 13 Umpire Coaches, including several on-field mentors. Our coaches completed a total of 490 match day reports across the season, providing valuable feedback to our umpires. Another major development opportunity each season is Behind the Bails, where ICC Match Officials join local registered match officials for a Q&A panel event ahead of the Adelaide Test Match. Ben Hook facilitated a discussion between Richard Illingworth, Richard Kettleborough, Phil Gillespie and Match Referee Ranjan Madugalle, some of the world's most experienced and renowned officials.

Some of our developing umpires were offered special opportunities to enhance their skills throughout the season. Collaboration between State and Territory Associations allowed for an ongoing umpire exchange program, with Tanmoy Sana travelling to Melbourne to stand in a two-day match between Melbourne 1st XI and Carlton 1st XI in the Victorian Premier Cricket Men's First Grade. South Australia Women player and emerging umpire Courtney Neale joined State Umpire Panel member James Cushway at the Cricket Australia U16 Female National Championships in Victoria, and Ali Cheema travelled to Mackay for the Cricket Australia National Indigenous Cricket Championships.

SACA commenced regular Accreditation workshops for new umpires and those wishing to consolidate and improve their skills. For the first time SACA offered a Women's Only Community Officiating Workshop to provide a welcoming learning environment for women and girls with varied cricket experience. We welcomed 34 new umpires in 2024/25. Over the past three seasons, the number of umpire appointments completed by the SACA Match Officials team has increased by 52%, equating to up to 1300 appointments a month in peak periods. This is a result of an increase in the number of Premier Cricket fixtures and hosting various National Championships and tournaments. The SACA Match Officials team also supports Adelaide Turf Cricket Association and various other affiliated Junior Associations in the appointment of umpires on a weekly basis.

The Australian Country Cricket Championships were held in the Barossa in early January, with 126 umpire appointments filled by 20 South Australian umpires. A further 126 scorer appointments were fulfilled, predominantly by South Australian scorers. Across Domestic cricket and the Cricket Australia U19 Male National Championships, SACA Match Officials made 181 scorer appointments, all undertaken by a core group of the 12 most experienced scorers.

The SACUSA Scorer Subcommittee continued to meet quarterly, allowing scorers to come together with SACA Match Officials staff to discuss appointments, accreditation and development. The subcommittee facilitated a valuable induction ahead of the Cricket Australia U19 Male National Championships, and a PlayHQ E-Scoring session was offered again this season to further support scorers who utilise this platform.

Eloise Sheridan and Drew Crozier were again appointed to Cricket Australia's Contracted Umpires Panel (CACUP), representing South Australia at a national level. Eloise spent much of her season standing in international cricket, including the CommBank Women's Ashes Series in Australia and two trips overseas for the India v West Indies Women's Series in December and the New Zealand v Sri Lanka Women's Series in March. Eloise was also appointed to the WBBL, BBL, Sheffield Shield and One Day Cup competitions. For 2024/25, Drew was named as a member of Cricket Australia's Umpire Leadership Group, providing support and mentoring to other CACUP umpires. He continues to be a mainstay in Domestic competitions, standing in the WBBL, BBL, Sheffield Shield, One Day Cup, and Men's Second XI. As members of our State Umpire Panel, Eloise and Drew also endeavour to be available for Premier Cricket as on-field mentors when possible.

The other members of the SACA State Umpire Panel represented South Australia at a high standard across various opportunities this season, including the following.

- Dhaval Bhatt – Cricket Australia U17 Male National Championships, WNCL & WBBL.
- James Cushway – Cricket Australia U16 Female National Championships, WNCL & WBBL.
- Peter George – Cricket Australia U19 Male National Championships, WNCL & WBBL.
- Kurt Miegel – Cricket Australia U19 Female National Championships, WNCL & WBBL.
- Mary Waldron – Women's Tour matches, WNCL, WBBL & awarded Premier Cricket Umpire of the Year.

As part of the Match Officials retention strategy, SACA with the support of SACUSA recognise umpires and scorers for career milestones. This season, new Milestone Awards were introduced to the Bradman Rolton Medal Night to acknowledge the outstanding achievement of Match Officials who had registered 300, 400, 500 or 600 career games.

Craig Thomas continued in the role of SACA Umpire Administration and Development Officer. His passion for supporting and developing umpires is unparalleled, we thank him for his ongoing dedication. Aashray Addagulla was a great contributor to the team as Match Officials Officer this season. We also thank our Umpire Coaches for their work in observing and providing feedback to umpires on a weekly basis, this helps us to continually improve the quality of umpiring in South Australia.

During the season we continued our positive relationship with SACUSA. We thank all members of the SACUSA Committee for their commitment and hard work in supporting match officials.

Congratulations to all umpires and scorers on your achievements this season. Match officials are critical to the game of cricket, thank you for your dedication.


These sponsors and supporters are of course in addition to the much-valued sponsorship provided by SACA, which funds a significant majority of the services and resources available to all umpires throughout the season.





S.A.C.U.S.A. HALL OF FAME

Selection Criteria and Guidelines for Induction to the SACUSA Hall of Fame

- Rule 1. Candidacy is open to all umpires and scorers meeting the selection criteria who behaved in a manner which was conducive with the spirit and objectives of SACUSA.
- Rule 2. The SACUSA Executive Committee must appoint a Selection Panel of three impartial and independent individuals who decide on the successful inductees.
- Rule 3. The SACUSA Executive Committee is charged with the task of presenting a shortlist of possible inductees to the Selection Panel.
- Rule 4. Candidates must have made a very significant contribution to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia over an extended period of time. A candidate's worthiness is purely at the discretion of the Selection Sub-committee in order to be considered for nomination.
- Rule 5. Candidates must have demonstrated an exceptional dedication to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia and must not have illustrated behavior that would suggest a conflict with the ideals held by SACUSA during the era that the candidate actively contributed.
- Rule 6. Candidates must not have been actively umpiring or scoring within the cricketing environment for at least two years prior to nomination.
- Rule 7. The Hall of Fame must be reviewed at least every two years.



NEIL DANSIE OAM AWARD



Neil Dansie OAM was an Australian first-class cricketer and long-term administrator for South Australia. He is the seventh leading run-scorer for South Australia in Sheffield Shield. Nicknamed "Nodder" due to his habit of nodding in agreement when in conversation, Dansie was born in Nuriootpa, South Australia, the grandson of Sam Dansie, a leading country cricketer who represented a Broken Hill team against the touring Marylebone Cricket Club side. Dansie moved to Adelaide with his family as a child and excelled in a wide range of sports, including cricket, Australian rules football and baseball. He made his 1st Grade debut for Kensington Cricket Club aged 15, one of the youngest ever debutants in the South Australian Grade Cricket League.

In January 1949, Dansie was the last player to bat with Don Bradman in an official match, when Bradman played his final innings for Kensington against Port Adelaide Cricket Club at Alberton Oval. Dansie made his first-class cricket debut on 27 January 1950 on the WACA Ground against WA making 36 and 13. Dansie quickly gained a reputation as a hard-hitting batsman with a liking for the pull, sweep and cut shots and a steady off-spin and leg-spin bowler, as well as being known as one of the great characters of South Australian cricket, including gaining the title of being the world's fastest eater. He became only the second player to reach the milestone of 100 Sheffield Shield appearances and he achieved this feat in 1966. He had a prolific run for South Australia in first-class cricket scoring 6692 runs which accounted for more than 3/4th of his total first-class runs. His total tally of 6692 runs in 107 first-class matches puts him in the list of all-time top run scorers for South Australia in Sheffield Shield history. Despite being touted as one of the brightest prospects in Australian domestic setup, he never received a Baggy Green Cap. He was touted by many as a potential test match prospect throughout the 1950s. Neil Dansie OAM was SACUSA patron from 2008/2009 until his passing in 2023.

The Neil Dansie OAM Memorial award is presented and recognises an individual who has contributed and volunteer to the members of SACUSA behind the scenes with a positive attitude, a willingness to help in whatever capacity necessary, and a commitment to excellence.

Criteria:

- The candidate can be from any association.
- The worthiness of the candidate will be determined by the SACUSA Committee from those received.






THE BRADMAN MEDAL

During season 1957/58 three SACUA Umpires, John McMenamin, Jack Kierse and Gordon Seymour, were enjoying a quiet drink after a SACUA meeting at the Hotel Adelaide in Pirie Street, when the 'idea' of an award for the best A Grade District Cricketer was proposed. The original award, first made after season 1958/59, was based on one vote per game for the best player during an 'A' Grade match.

The first presentation dinner was held at the Seven Stars Hotel in Angas Street, Adelaide and was attended by approximately 30 umpires. Votes were counted during the dinner. At the conclusion of the count, joint winners Ian McLachlan and Brian Quigley were announced. Neither of the winners were in attendance and taxis were sent to their homes to bring them to the dinner to receive their award.

During season 1976/77 it was decided that the District Cricketer Award should be renamed as the Bradman Medal and Sir Donald Bradman was approached for his approval. "The Don" agreed and said that he would be honoured to have the award named after him. The presentation of this prestigious award has continued, and the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner is now recognised as the pinnacle of any cricket season in South Australia.

Season 2007/08 celebrated 50 years since the start of the District Cricketer Award/Bradman Medal. To celebrate this occasion winners (or family members) of the District Cricketer Award from 1958/59 to 1975/76 were presented with a Bradman Medal at the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner on 19th March 2008. Also, on the night three players who lost on a countback were awarded Bradman Medals.

THE SINCOCK MEDAL

The **Sincock Medal** is awarded to: -

"The Premier First Grade Division Two Cricketer who polls the highest number of votes cast by each umpire."

The factors that govern the award comprise

- Actual cricket ability displayed.
- Player's attitude towards the game.
- Player's demeanor, behavior, and dress.

Sincock Medal Winner – Henry Cullen



During the 2023/2024 season, the first-grade men's competition was divided into two divisions. It became clear to SACUSA that Premier Cricket participants favoured separate medals for each division. While we believe there are valid reasons for both options, fundamentally SACUSA provide Premier Cricket medals to recognise player excellence and we therefore decided to respect their views and strike a new medal for 1st Grade, 2nd Division to recognise their achievements. SACUSA decided to name the new 2nd Division medal the Sincock Medal in recognition of Andrew Sincock OAM for his lifelong service to Cricket in SA.

Andrew is a former first-class cricketer who played for South Australia and was a fast bowler. Sincock was vice captain on the Australian school boys tour of the West Indies in 1969–70. He made his first-class debut in 1974 and was the opening bowler for the 1981/82 South Australian Sheffield Shield winning team. That season he took his best figures 5-56. Andrew played as well as coached at both Representative and Premier/Grade level at numerous Premier/Grade Clubs and at virtually all levels, winning two Bradman Medals and one Wilson/McCloud Medal.

After retirement he was Head Coach of the West End Redbacks and AIS Cricket Academy. Sincock was elected to the South Australian Cricket Association (SACA) Board in 2000 and was vice president in 2013. He was awarded the Order of Australia Medal in 2017 for services to cricket.




